Study Questions

1). Read Jeremiah 3:8 + 14-17 – What do we learn from these verses about the relationship of God the Father with national Israel?

a). How does what we see in v14-17 explain why God the Father passes the redemption of the inheritance to His Son?

2). Read Revelation 5:11-14 – What do we see in these verses and why is it happening?

a). Which Scripture did we look at in connection with v13?

3). Read Ruth 4:9-11 – What do we learn in these verses about Boaz's marriage to Ruth?

a). What do these verses teach us about the antitype?

b). What do we not see in Ruth 4:9-11, that we do see in Revelation and how does Revelation portray it to us?

c). Which verses did we look at in connection with this?

4). Read Revelation 19:7-9 – What do we know from these verses because of what the type from Ruth teaches us?

a). What happens following the Lord's return to the earth and which Scripture did we look at in connection with this?

5). Read Ruth 4:13-15 – What do we see in v13?

a). Who now becomes central to the narrative and how does what we read about her here compare with what we read when she returned to Bethlehem?

b). What do the events of Ruth 4:13-15 look like in the antitype?

c). Which foundational types did we see fulfilled in this?

6). Read Ruth 4:16-21 – Why does the Book of Ruth end with a genealogy?

a). Read Matthew 1:3-6 – Whose genealogy is given in Matthew Chapter 1?

c). Read Matthew 20:30 [not in Sunday's message] – What are these men saying through the expression 'Son of David'? And what Scripture would we go to in order to see it?

d). Putting all this together, what is significant about the Book of Ruth ending with David?
