1). Read Acts 7:23-29 – What did Moses do that he supposed the Children of Israel would understand that God had sent him to deliver them?


a). Looking at v27 again – What is the Children of Israel's reaction?

a). What is significant about Moses meeting the 7 daughters of Reuel by a well of water?


b). What does Moses marriage to Zipporah picture?


c). Read v20 again – how does this verse connect with what the Lord says to the Church in Ephesus and the Church in Laodicea in the Revelation?

d). Who can Gershom picture for us and how would the timing of his birth enable us to see this?


e). Read Exodus 18:1-4 – Moses had 2 sons, a fact first noted in Exodus Chapter 4, but the second, Eliezer, is not introduced until Exodus Chapter 18 – Why do you think this is? [We are looking to see if there is a type here – As you read v1-4 think about what future time this pictures. Then think about what happens in this future time before Christ returns to the earth that involves the birth of a male child.]

a). Read Exodus 3:1-10 – What do we see in these verses through the symbolism of ‘the mountain of God’ and the ‘flame of fire’?

b). With regards to Israel, what is the connection between them, the mountain and the fire?

c). What is significant about the bush burning but not being consumed?

d). Where is God in relation to the bush and which scriptures did we look at that help explain this?

e). Where in scripture do we find other examples of that pictured through the bush that is not consumed?

f). We are at the place in Exodus in our study where Israel is being severely afflicted and in need of deliverance, but how does the Book of Exodus end and what can we learn from this?
