Study Questions

1). What does the time gap between Saul's rejection as king and his removal from the throne picture for us?

a). Where does God's purpose to replace Satan start in the scriptures and how long will it take to bring to completion?

b). What are the various things that must be brought to pass before God's purpose is completed?

2). Read 1 Samuel 22:1-2 – What can we know about those who gathered themselves together with David?

a). Which verses did we look at out of 2 Corinthians Chapter 6 that we can apply to the actions of those gathering themselves to David?

b). How would these same verses apply to us?

c). Read John 17:15-20 – What can we learn about our present situation from these verses?

3). Read 1 Samuel 26:8 – Wouldn't David have been much safer if he had killed Saul who was trying to kill him? – Where was his safety?

a). Read Ezekiel 28:14 – According to this verse, who is Satan?

b). How do we know from the scriptures that Satan still remains God's anointed?

c). What then should our attitude towards Satan be?

d). With regards to the spiritual warfare, where is our safety to be found?

e). Which verses did we look at out of 2 Samuel Chapter 1 that give us insight into the consequences of attacking Satan?

f). Which verses did we look at that provide a parallel to these verses from 1 Samuel?

g). Read Matthew 7:24-27 – what additional teaching do these verses provide to those which we have just read?

4). Read 2 Samuel 1:5-8 – what is the poignant irony we find in these verses?

a). What were the 2 outcomes facing Saul based on his choice of faithfulness or unfaithfulness?

b). What should we learn from this for ourselves?

c). What does Revelation Chapter 3 have to say about this?
