6 7	WHEREAS,	the purpose of a Capital Improvement Program (CIP) is to plan for and	
8	prioritize public improvement projects over the next ten years; and		
9	WHEREAS	, the 2019-2021 Capital Improvement Budget (CIB) identifies specific	
10	projects and their budgets for consideration and approval by the Governing Body as		
11	required by Topek	a Municipal Code (TMC) Sec. A12-17; and	
12	WHEREAS	, the document entitled "2019-2028 Proposed Capital Improvement	
13	Plan," dated March 13, 2018 ("CIP Book") contains the CIP, CIB, and all associated project		
14	budgets and is attached herein and incorporated by reference; and		
15	WHEREAS, for purposes of planning and allocating resources the Governing Body		
16	should consider and approve the CIP and CIB and the specific project budgets contained		
17	therein.		
18	NOW, THE	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governing Body takes the	
19	following actions:		
20	1. The	CIP. The Governing Body approves and adopts the 2019-2028 Capital	
21	Improvement Plan	n contained in the CIP Book at pages 7-11.	
22	2. The	CIB. The Governing Body also approves and adopts the 2019-2021	
23	Capital Improvem	ent Budget contained in the CIP Book at pages 7-9.	
24	3. 201	9-2021 CIB Project Budgets. TMC Sections A12-17 and A12-25 of the	
25	require Governing	Body approval of all project budgets and project budget amendments for	
26	public improvements.		

- (a) G.O. Bonded Projects. With regard to the projects identified on pages 21 through 23, 37, 40, 47 through 49, 51, 54 through 58, and 60 through 62 in the CIP Book, the Governing Body finds that the public improvements described are necessary and serve the public interest. Accordingly, the Governing Body authorizes such projects, pursuant to TMC Section A12-1 and approves all project budgets, including amended budgets, for 2019, 2020 and 2021.
- (b) G.O. Bonded Project/Fire Equipment. With regard to the projects identified on pages 28 through 32 in the CIP Book, the Governing Body finds that the fire equipment described therein is necessary and serves the public interest. Accordingly, the Governing Body authorizes such projects and approves all project budgets, including amended budgets, for 2019, 2020 and 2021.

Moreover, the Governing Body intends to acquire the fire-fighting equipment and pay the cost by issuing general obligation bonds maturing not more than 15 years from their date of issuance as authorized by K.S.A. 12-110c. Pursuant to K.S.A. 12-110c, the Governing Body directs the City Clerk to publish a notice of its intention to acquire equipment that has not previously been the subject of a notice of intention, stating the cost and the City's intention to issue general obligation bonds. The notice shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official City newspaper. If, within 60 days following the last date of publication, a petition signed by not less than 5% of the qualified electors of the City of Topeka is filed with the City Clerk, no such bonds shall be issued until the matter of whether to issue general obligation bonds has been approved by a majority of the qualified electors of the City voting at an election called pursuant to the general bond law.

- (c) Enterprise Funded Projects. With regard to the projects identified on pages 64 through 67, 68, 69, 71, 72, 74 through 81, 83, 84, 86 through 88, 90, 92, 95 through 102, and 104 of the CIP Book, the Governing Body finds that the improvements to its waterworks system, sanitary and/or stormwater system are necessary and serve the public interest. Accordingly, the Governing Body authorizes such projects, pursuant to TMC Sections A12-1 and A18-3(d) and approves all project budgets, including amended budgets, for 2019, 2020 and 2021. No revenue bonds shall be issued unless the Governing Body enacts a separate resolution and notice of intent to issue revenue bonds in accordance with K.S.A. 10-1201 et seq.
- (d) Cash-Funded Projects. With regard to the projects identified on pages 43, 85, 107, 109, 111 through 113, 115 through 118, 120, 121, 123 through 134, 136 through 139, 141-143, 148 through 150, 154 through 169, and 171 through 174 in the CIP Book, the Governing Body finds that the public improvements are necessary and serve the public interest. Accordingly, the Governing Body authorizes such projects and approves all project budgets, including amended budgets, for 2019, 2020 and 2021.
- 4. The City both reasonably expects and intends to finance the costs of said improvements (other than the Cash-Fund Projects in section d) from the proceeds of bonds of the City. The City does hereby express its official intent to reimburse any such pre-issuance original expenditures (as defined in Treas. Reg. I.150-2(c)) made by it on or after the date which is 60 days before the date of this Resolution from the proceeds of such bonds in the estimated maximum principal amount of \$ 156,095,110. The City will issue such bonds for such purposes and make the reimbursements within eighteen (18) months after the date the expenditure to be reimbursed was paid or, if later, eighteen (18) months after the date on which the property resulting from the expenditure was placed in service.

74	Provided, that, in any event, the City must make the reimbursement allocation within three		
75	(3) years after the date the expenditure was paid. This Resolution, as the expression of the		
76	governing body's official intent regarding the matters described herein, will be available for		
77	public inspection in the City Clerk's office at City Hall during regular business hours of the		
78	City.		
79	5.	This Resolution shall become effective upon passage and approval by the	
80	City Governing Body.
