
International Post Graduate Diploma in Healthcare Management



1. PREAMBLE:

The lack of trained health care managers and leaders who can efficiently manage health care institutions in resource-limited settings is well known. The recent pandemic highlighted the critical need for strong health care systems and effective leadership. To address this need, a 2-year online Post Graduate Diploma in Health Care Management is being offered in partnership with International Christian Medical and Dental Association (ICMDA), Christian Medical College Vellore (CMC) and Loma Linda University (LLU).

The International Post Graduate Diploma in Healthcare Management (I-PGDHCM) is a 2-year, online, blended learning course in Healthcare Management. The course components will consist of self-learning interactive modules supported by monthly online contact sessions, a capstone project and a facilitated onsite learning exposure in identified institutions across the globe.

2. COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- Comprehensive understanding of health systems, universal health coverage, and social determinants of health to analyse, strengthen, and transform healthcare delivery.
- Strategic thinking, governance, and leadership skills to effectively manage resources, address healthcare challenges, and promote patient-centric, equitable systems.
- Inclusive healthcare practices informed by cross-cultural health perspectives, poverty, and social exclusion, with the ability to collaborate with community structures and faith-based organisations.
- In-depth knowledge of hospital management principles, including operations, finance, HR, and planning for sustainable healthcare delivery.
- Expertise in quality management, legal frameworks, patient care, communication, and building partnerships for hospital performance improvement.
- Skills in disaster management, with the ability to develop resilient healthcare organisations and support community disaster preparedness.
- Capacity to design and implement innovative primary health care programs targeting marginalised populations using technology and community engagement strategies.

3. NUMBER OF SEATS: 75 seats

4. COURSE DURATION: 2 Years

5. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- The I-PGDHCM is open to all professionals working in a healthcare system, with a focus on those serving in low and middle-income countries.
- Candidates must hold a recognised degree in healthcare or management. And have a minimum of 2 years of work experience in a healthcare context.
- All course materials, lectures, and contact sessions will be conducted in English.
 Candidates must demonstrate proficiency in reading, writing, and speaking English.
- Candidates must have regular access to the internet with sufficient bandwidth to download course materials and submit assignments.

6.2 Monthly online contact programs

Monthly online synchronous zoom sessions will be part of the course curriculum. Regular attendance in the monthly sessions is a mandatory requirement for successful completion of the course.

6.3 Capstone project

Students are required to complete a capstone project as part of the course requirements.

6.4 Facilitated onsite learning exposure

Students will spend five days at a designated healthcare institution and its affiliated outreach or primary health program.

6.5 Assessments

The course assessment is done in two parts: (1) formative assessment (throughout the course) and (2) summative assessment (at the end of each year's work). The formative and summative assessments have equal weightage in the final assessment.

7. CRITERIA FOR THE AWARD OF THE I-PGDHCM COURSE CERTIFICATE:

Participants must achieve:

- 80% attendance in the monthly online sessions
- 50% pass mark for end-of-module assignments and year 1 and 2 examinations
- Successful completion of Project Work
- Successful completion of facilitated onsite learning exposure

8. COURSE FEES:

Application fees: USD 10 (Non-refundable)

Tuition fees: USD 1000 per year

Travel and accommodation expenses for the facilitated onsite learning exposure visit will have to be borne by the student separately.
