#### The Counterintuitive Kingdom

Mark 15:40-47

## The humble and lowly are exalted.

- 1. The passage is bracketed by the eyewitness account of a few women (v. 40-41, 47).
  - a. Mary Magdalene had been possessed by 7 demons (Luke 8:2)
  - b. Mary the mother of James the Less and Joses
  - c. Salome mother of the sons of Zebedee (James and John)
    - i. These were the disciples who asked if they could be seated at Jesus' left and right (Mark 10:35-40).
    - ii. It was their mother who was faithful at the hardest time.
  - d. They were counted among those who ministered to Jesus (v. 41).
  - e. God used these faithful women to be the foundation of a credible witness.
- 2. They were fully and faithfully present even in the midst of the chaos, the tension, and the grief (vv. 40, 47).
  - a. They continued to care for Him even in His death.
  - b. They did what they knew to do to watch and attend to their Savior even though they did not know how things would turn out.
  - c. During a dark and somewhat hopeless time, this faithful group of women is exalted as those who watched and ministered to Jesus even in His death.

#### [Application]

- 1. Where do you feel the tension of living in the in between?
- 2. What does ministering faithfully to Jesus look like for you right now?
- 3. Whatever doubts you have, whatever excuses you may think of, remember, God takes the humble, the lowly, and the weak, and He uses them for great glory.

## The rich and powerful risk everything.

- 1. Who was Joseph of Arimathea?
  - a. Prominent member of the Council, the Sanhedrin powerful (v. 43)
  - b. Wealthy (Matthew 27:57)
  - c. A secret disciple up until this point (John 19:38)
    - i. Fear of losing everything (John 12:42)
  - d. Waiting for the kingdom of God (v. 43)
  - e. Had not consented to the plan to kill Jesus (Luke 23:51)
  - f. Church history tradition says he may have been the rich young ruler.
- 2. What did he do?
  - a. He risked everything.
    - i. Once ruled by fear he now gathers courage and does the next faithful thing to do (v. 43).
    - ii. "When evening fell..." probably about 3pm the "first" evening
      - 1. It was not lawful to leave a dead body on a tree overnight (Deut. 21:23).
        - a. It would have been extra offensive to leave a body on a cross during the Sabbath.
        - b. This was a special Sabbath Passover (John 19:31).
    - iii. At his own cost he purchased burial garments and buried Jesus in an expensive tomb.
      - 1. Joseph was publicly aligning himself and his family with the person of Jesus.
      - 2. There was no one else to do it the disciples had all fled (Matthew 26:56).
  - b. Accompanied by Nicodemus (John 19:39-40)
    - i. Came to Jesus at night (John 3:2)
    - ii. Now boldly takes care of the body of Jesus (John 19:39)

#### [Application]

- 1. What would it look like for you to risk everything? What's at stake? What are you not willing to risk in order to follow after Christ?
- 2. What might be the next faithful thing to do?

### The Counterintuitive King

- 1. Jesus was the ultimate humble and lowly one who became exalted (Phil 2:8-11).
- 2. Jesus was the rich man who risked everything (Phil 2:5-7).
- 3. Jesus was the suffering servant who brought healing to all who believe (Isaiah 53).
- 4. In Jesus' finished work on the cross He has paid for our fear, our faithlessness, and our rebellion.
- 5. We take courage because Christ has freed us from our guilt and leads us in love.
  - a. What else could convince these men to come forward after Jesus died?!
  - b. What else would keep the women ministering to Jesus in the midst of their grief?

# [Application]

- 1. The already and not yet the motivation of love lets us live in the tension.
- 2. We respond to the love that Christ demonstrated by faithfully and lovingly following Him, by doing the next faithful thing in response to His great love.
