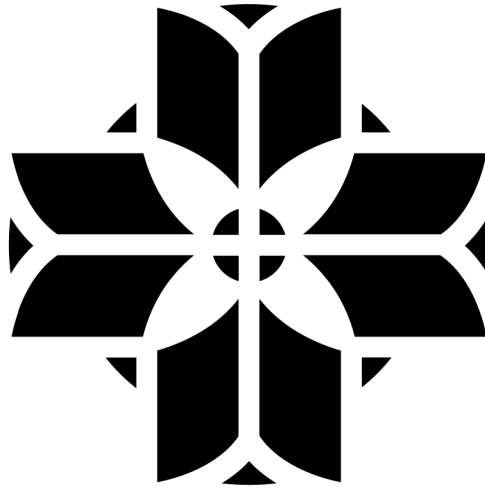

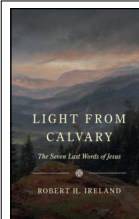

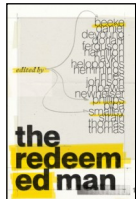

Check-in

No Sunday School on July 5

All Nations Class *meets in the Library, facilitated by several members including Kellie Grathwol, Deb Grathwol, and Jeremy Samsoe* | This class provides a welcoming environment to connect across language and cultural differences as we visit, read the Scripture passage, pray together, and have open discussion.

An Invitation to Our Neighbors: The Call to Biblical Hospitality *meets in the Sanctuary, led by Pastor Burress McCombe and Ruling Elder Emeritus Steve Draper* | This class will explore hospitality as a normal and joyful practice of Christian discipleship. Participants will examine biblical foundations for hospitality, learn practical ways to welcome neighbors and church members, and develop sustainable habits of everyday ministry through the home and table.

Parenting Class *meets in Multi-purpose Room East, taught by Ruling Elder Larry Chico and Amy Chico* | This is a class for parents of children of all ages still living in the home. We will be using Scripture and the book "Shepherding a Child's Heart" by Tedd Tripp as the source of material to be covered in the class. Though optional, participants are encouraged to purchase the book (copies are available in the Book Nook) and read material ahead of time in order to receive maximum benefit from the class. The weekly class structure will generally consist of a quick overview of topics from Scripture and the book, followed by small-group discussion of related questions.

Reflection and Reorientation *meets in Room 207, taught by Pastor Phil Mahaffey, Pastor Tim Frost, and Associate Director of Women's Ministries Sarah DeBoer* | This class will offer an opportunity for the Spanish congregation to process the past few years, ask questions, and talk about shared hopes for what God has in store for the future. This class will be in Spanish.

Through the Roof Adults *meets in W-10, led by members Linda Krause, Jason Miller, and Sarah Pruett* | This class provides adults affected by disability with the opportunity to connect and digest God's Word in an easy-to-understand format. Join us on the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Sundays.

Through the Roof Support Group *meets in W-10, led by members Laura Flint and Sarah Pruett* | This class provides parents, grandparents, and caregivers the opportunity to connect, share resources, and discuss challenges that come with living and caring for a child or adult with a disability. Join us on the 2nd and 4th Sundays.

Electronic Giving

We have set up online giving as a convenience for you to give on a one-time or ongoing basis. There is a feature that lets you donate to cover the processing fees charged by credit card companies. The box is automatically checked with the amount filled in. If you'd rather not add this amount to your donation, simply uncheck the box. You may also donate through the Church Center app. After you log on to the app, click on the "GIVE" button.



Online Banking - Bill Pay

Another easy and convenient way to give is to use the online bill pay feature, often available through online banking at many banks; you will need to check with your bank to verify its availability. When using this feature, request that a paper check be sent to the church office rather than an electronic check, and a check in the amount you designate will be sent directly from the bank to Covenant Presbyterian Church.
