Lesson 2 The Case of the Floating Basket



Birth of Moses

Exodus 1:8-2:10

The sons of Israel who came to Egypt had many children. They grew strong and lived in many places in the land.

Now there was a new king over Egypt. He did not know Joseph.

The king said, "The people of Israel are too many. They are too mighty for us. Let us make a wise plan to deal with them."

They put slave masters over the people of Israel. The masters gave them heavy burdens. They made the people of Israel work as slaves.

Then Pharaoh told his people, "Every son who is born to the Hebrews you shall throw into the Nile River."

Now a Levite woman gave birth to a son. She hid him for three months. When she could hide him no longer, she made a basket of bulrushes. She covered it with tar and put her child in it. She put the basket among the reeds by the riverbank.

The baby's sister stood at a distance. She wanted to know what would happen to him.

Now the daughter of Pharaoh came down to bathe at the river. Her young women walked beside the river. Pharaoh's daughter saw the basket among the reeds. She sent her servant to get it.

When Pharaoh's daughter opened it, she saw the child. The baby was crying. Pharaoh's daughter took pity on him. She said, "This is one of the Hebrew's children."

Then the child's sister said, "Shall I call a Hebrew woman to nurse the child for you?"

And Pharaoh's daughter said, "Go." The girl went and got her mother.

Pharaoh's daughter said to the mother, "Take this child away. Nurse him for me. I will give you wages."

So the woman took the child. And when the child grew up, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter. Then he became her son. She named him Moses.
