Luke 19:1–10

- This week, your child learned that a tax collector named Zacchaeus was sorry for his sins. Jesus forgave him, and He forgives us too.
- Zacchaeus climbed up into a sycamore fig tree to see Jesus over the crowd. Lift your child up on your shoulders and have him or her see how tall Zacchaeus felt in a tree.
- Invite someone to your house for dinner and talk about Jesus with them.
- What have you lost recently? How was the missing item found? Did you know that we were lost too? Jesus came to the world to save us when we were lost in sin.
- As a family, thank God for sending Jesus to save us when we are lost in sin.





The Triumphal Entry

Mark 11:1–10; Luke 19:28–40

- This week, we studied Palm Sunday. One week before His resurrection, Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey. He went into Jerusalem to die for our sins so that we can live with Him in heaven.
- On Palm Sunday, people praised God as Jesus rode into Jerusalem. Draw a picture to show how you like to praise God.
- When Jesus came into Jerusalem, people sang songs of praise. Make up your own song using the words “Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!” (Mark 11:9).
- As a family, thank Jesus for riding into Jerusalem to die for us and save us.
