He took our sins away.

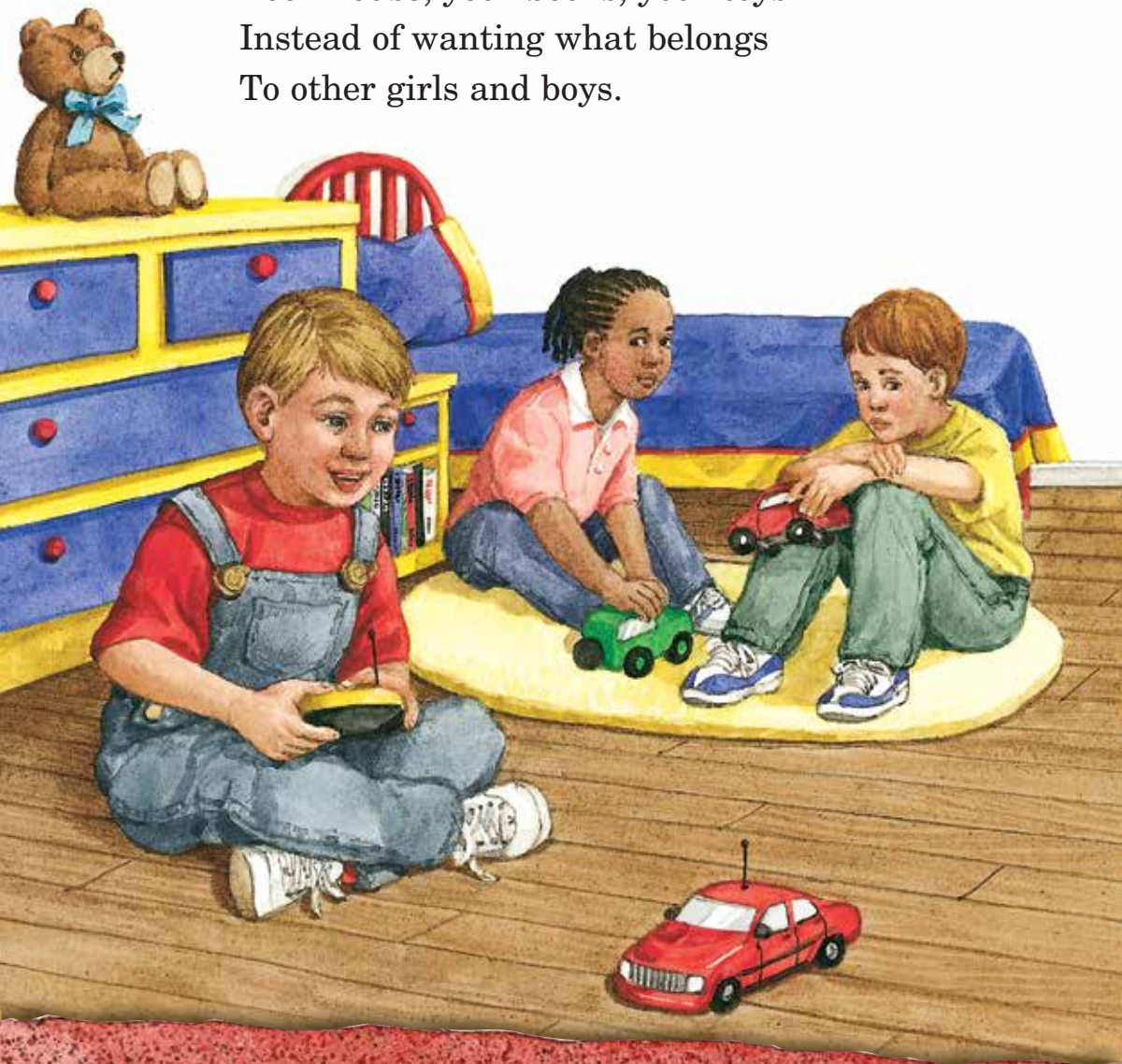
The Holy Spirit comes to us

About them just to you.

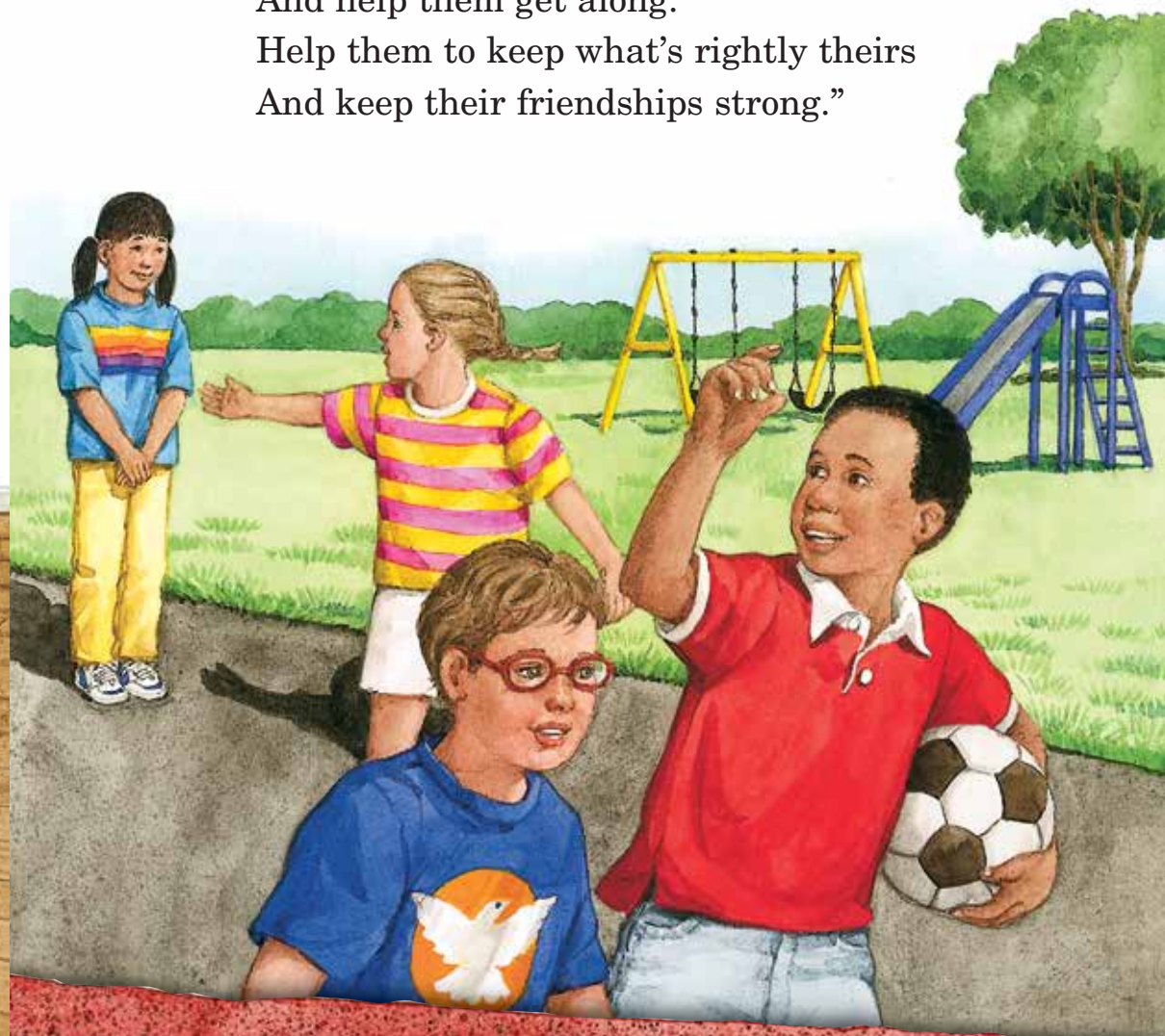


“Be thankful for the things you have—
