Welcome to our new school year!

It's a pleasure to be your partner in the Christian education of your child. Your child, you, and I will travel together on a wonderful faith journey this year. As we work together to help your child grow in faith in Jesus, you and I will grow in faith too.

Together, we'll show your child that *Christian* is not just a name; it's a life of grace empowered by the Holy Spirit. 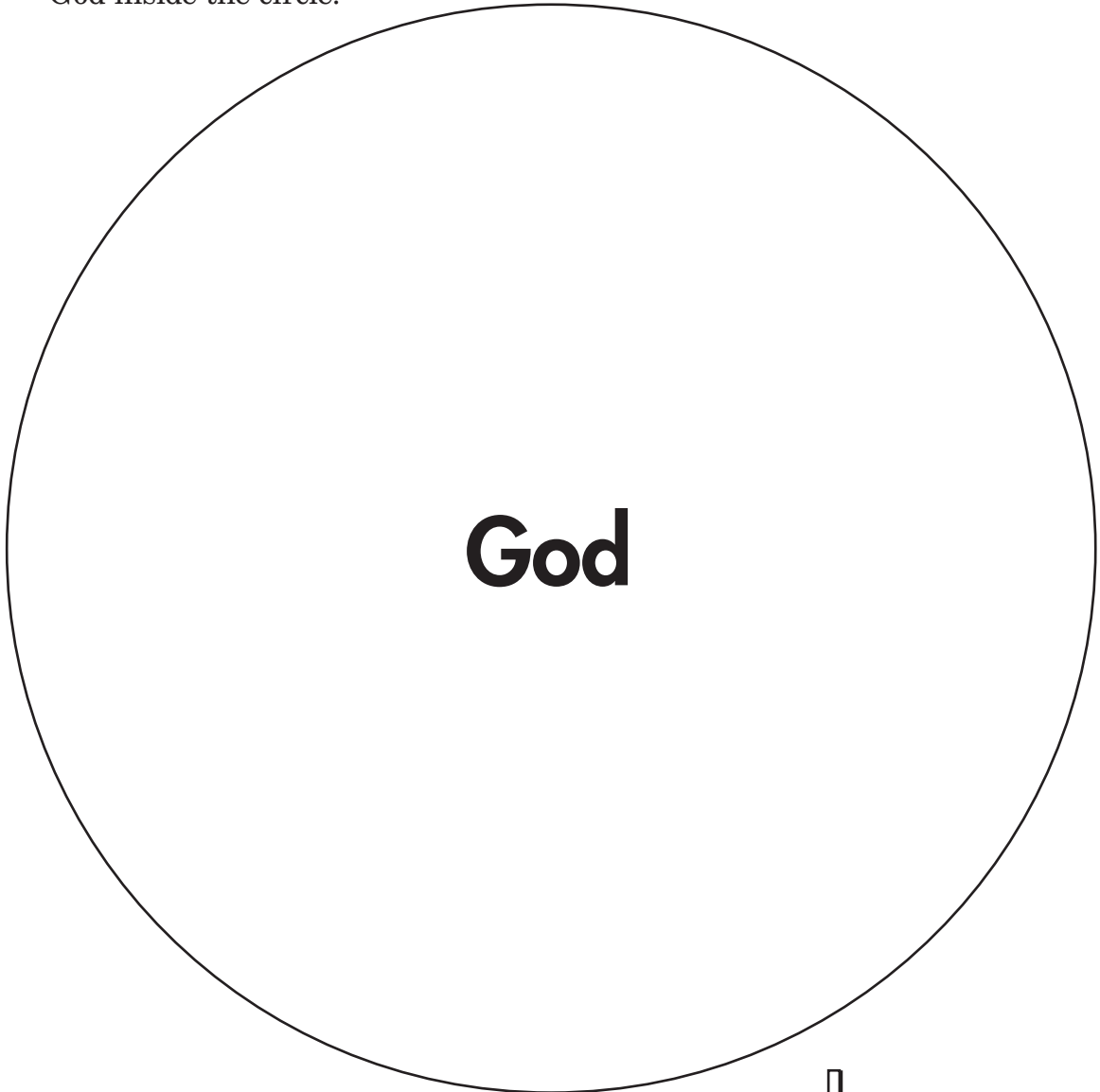

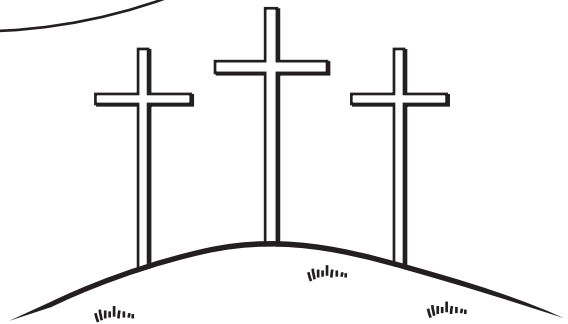
