

Note to Parents & Teachers

When Naaman looked back on the events of his life, he must have realized how God's plan for him unfolded even through his leprosy. God had provided a servant girl in his household who knew the one true God and trusted in His healing love. Information provided by the girl led Naaman to Elisha, the prophet of God. Elisha told Naaman to wash seven times in the Jordan River and God would heal him of his leprosy. Naaman did as Elisha directed and received God's healing.

Just as Naaman was healed from his leprosy when he followed God's directions (given through the prophet Elisha) and washed himself in the Jordan River, we receive spiritual healing when our sins are washed away in the waters of Baptism.



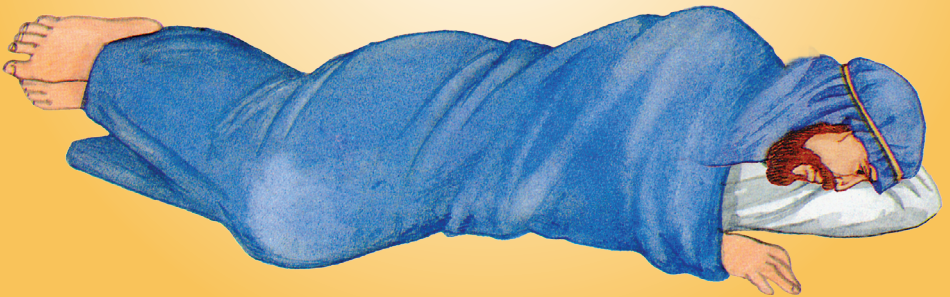
