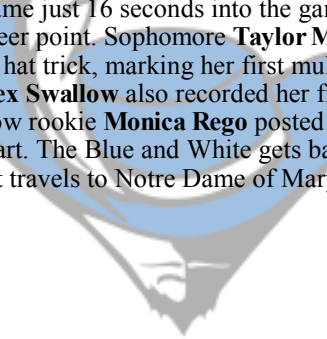
## CSAC HONOR ROLL

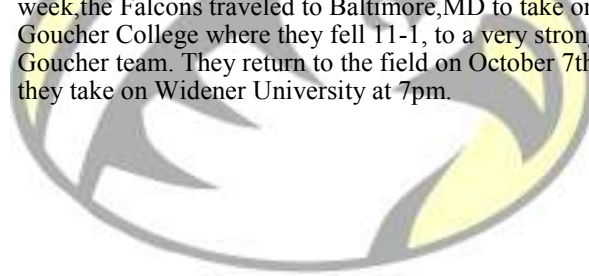
**CABRINI CAVALIERS (6-3, 2-0 CSAC)**

Cabrini extended its win streak to five games with Saturday's 8-2 win over Marywood. The victory improved the Cavaliers to 6-3 overall and 2-0 in the CSAC. Junior **Kerry Anne Farrell** reached a career milestone in the victory, as the first of her three goals came just 16 seconds into the game and marked her 100th career point. Sophomore **Taylor Mack** also completed a first half hat trick, marking her first multi-goal game. Freshman **Alex Swallow** also recorded her first career goal in the win. Fellow rookie **Monica Rego** posted three saves in her first career start. The Blue and White gets back to work on Tuesday, as it travels to Notre Dame of Maryland.



**CEDAR CREST FALCONS (0-8, 0-2 CSAC)**

It was homecoming and Fall Family Weekend at Cedar Crest College this weekend as the Field Hockey team hosted Keystone College in a Colonial States Athletic Conference game. It was the first conference game for the Falcons since they traveled to Immaculata on September 27th where they fell 9-1. The Falcons would fall at homecoming 8-0. Earlier this week, the Falcons traveled to Baltimore, MD to take on Goucher College where they fell 11-1, to a very strong Goucher team. 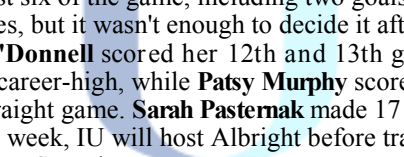
**GWYNEDD MERCY GRIFFINS (7-3, 1-0 CSAC)**

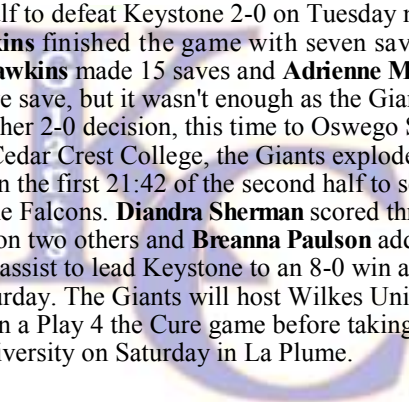
**IMMACULATA MIGHTY MACS (4-8, 1-1 CSAC)**

On Saturday at Neumann, regulation was not enough to decide the tight contest, but the Knights eventually scored the game-winner in double overtime to take the 4-3 victory. The teams alternated goals for the first six of the game, including two goals in the last ten minutes, but it wasn't enough to decide it after regulation. **Ashley O'Donnell** scored her 12th and 13th goals of the season, a career-high, while **Patsy Murphy** scored for the second straight game. **Sarah Pasternak** made 17 saves in goal. This week, IU will host Albright before travelling to Keystone on Saturday.



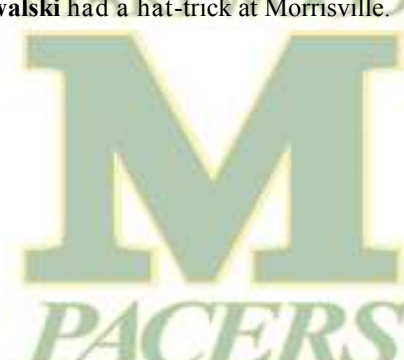
**KEYSTONE GIANTS (2-10, 1-2 CSAC)**

On Saturday at Cedar Crest College, the Giants exploded for seven goals in the first 21:42 of the second half to score an 8-0 win over the Falcons. **Diandra Sherman** scored three goals and assisted on two others and **Breanna Paulson** added three goals and an assist to lead Keystone to an 8-0 win at Cedar Crest on Saturday. 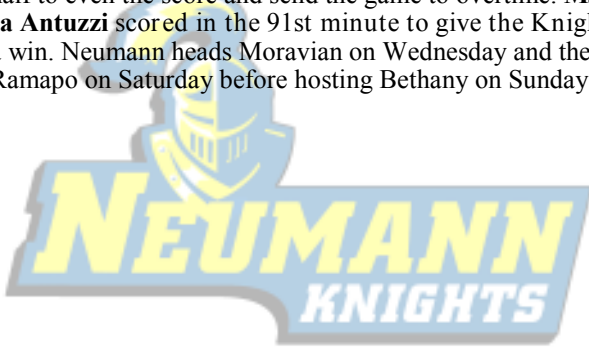
**MARYWOOD PACERS (5-6, 1-2 CSAC)**
