AROUND THE CSAC

BAPTIST BIBLE DEFENDERS (0-7, 0-2)

Playing only one game this past week, the Lady Defenders fell at the hands of Kean University, 82-40. **Callie Kitowski** recorded another double-double, netting 13 points and grabbing 12 rebounds. Her low post teammate, **Megan Wagner** was the only other Lady Defender in double digits, as she scored 11 points on 3-for-4 shooting and also went 5-for-6 from the charity stripe. BBC will resume their season on January 7, when they welcome Cedar Crest College to town for a 6:00pm game.

CABRINI CAVALIERS (4-2, 2-0)

The Cavaliers did not compete last week, as the student-athletes focused on final exams. Cabrini will return to action on Wednesday as it travels to the University of Scranton for the Poinsettia Classic. The Blue and White will face Richard Stockton on Wednesday, before facing the No. 6 Royals on Thursday.

CAIRN HIGHLANDERS (2-4, 0-1)

The Highlanders were off this week due to finals and have gone on their Christmas breaks. They will return to action in January with a game at home against Cedar Crest College on the 5th.

CEDAR CREST FALCONS (1-8, 0-2)

Cedar Crest lost to Franklin & Marshall, 59-43, in their only contest of the week. **Taylor Osley** registered a team-high 11 points while **Breonna Lewis** and **Miranda Schaeffer** contributed nine apiece. The Falcons' next contest is slated for Jan. 3 at Penn State Brandywine.

CENTENARY CYCLONES (2-5, 1-1)

The women's basketball team was idle this week. They will return to action Saturday December 20th as they hit the road to face SUNY - Old Westbury @ 12pm.

GWYNEDD MERCY GRIFFINS (3-4, 2-1)

Sophomore **Charlotte Kucowski** and junior **Olivia Bradford** each scored 12 points apiece, but the Griffins fell to Richard Stockton, 58-49, at home on Monday night. Freshman **Julianna Hoisington** was not far behind with a season-high 11 points, hitting all three three-point attempts. **Bradford** also made a career-best five steals in the loss. Gwynedd Mercy will close out their slate of games before the holiday break this week with a home date with Catholic on Monday and a road contest at Juniata on Saturday.

IMMACULATA MIGHTY MACS (3-5, 2-0)

Immaculata's only contest last week with a 53-52 loss on the road to Haverford. Immaculata was able to tie the score and go ahead by one (52-51) after **Brittany Merkle** connected on two free throws with 39 seconds remaining. The Fords then used the clock setting up the game-winning jumper with two seconds left. **Adriana Sciascia** had a team-high 18 points as she finished 4-for-6 from the three-point arc. **Merkle** added nine points and a team-high six rebounds. Immaculata hosts Ursinus Wednesday as it closes out the 2014 portion of the schedule.

NOTRE DAME GATORS (3-5, 1-2)

After finals week, Notre Dame hosted non-conference rival Trinity Washington University Saturday. Notre Dame had four players reach double-figures as they defeated TWU 69-61 in their second consecutive win of the season. **Stephanie Roche** scored a career high 20 points, shooting 75% from beyond the arc with six three pointers. **Zaria Comer** had her fifth career double-double with 17 points and 11 rebounds. The Gators travel Monday and Tuesday for their last two games of 2014.

ROSEMONT RAVENS (2-6, 1-2)

On Monday **Liz Coyne** led the Ravens with 24 points as Rosemont survived a late comeback in regulation and a "Hail Mary" three-point bucket at the buzzer ending the first overtime to ultimately defeat the DeSales Bulldogs 72-70 in double overtime at Central Valley. It was the first time that the program had defeated DeSales (Rosemont now 1-4 head-to-head vs. DeSales since 1997).
