Terranella was named the Sleep Inn-Dunmore Holiday Classic Most Valuable Player after lead-

ing the Pacers to wins over King's and Mt. Aloysius. She averaged 15 points and seven rebounds in the two wins. Terranella scored 21 points and eight boards in a win over the Monarchs. She shot .571 from the floor and added three steals and five assists.

## AROUND THE CSAC

### BAPTIST BIBLE DEFENDERS (0-7, 0-2)

Easing back into action, the Lady Defenders have just one game this week as they hit the road for a Wednesday night CSAC contest against Cedar Crest College.

### CABRINI CAVALIERS (7-3, 2-0)

The Cavaliers improved to 7-3 overall after splitting a pair of outings at the San Juan Shootout in Puerto Rico. No. 2 Thomas More scored in the final 30 seconds of action to top Cabrini 56-55, despite a career high 19 points from senior **Megan Decker**. One day later, the Blue and White rebounded for a 59-42 win over Ithaca behind 19 points and 18 rebounds by senior **Amber Keys**. Junior **Meghan Martin** added 15 points in the victory. Cabrini will return to Nerney Field House on Monday, as it hosts Ursinus. The Cavaliers will visit Keystone on Wednesday before welcoming Cairn to campus on Saturday.

### CAIRN HIGHLANDERS (2-4, 0-1)

The Highlanders were off this week due to finals and have gone on their Christmas breaks. They will return to action in January with a game at home against Cedar Crest College on the 5th.

### CEDAR CREST FALCONS (1-9, 0-2)

Looking to start 2015 off on the right foot, the Cedar Crest basketball team took to the road for a non-conference showdown with their third Penn State opponent of the season playing the host PSU-Brandywine. For the Falcons **Breonna Lewis** once again led the charge collecting her seventh double-double of the season with 16 points and 11 rebounds while **DeJanet Lantion** finished with eight points and six rebounds. Sophomore **Taylor Osley** added seven points in the 2015 opener while **Kayleigh Keggan** added another seven as well.

### CENTENARY CYCLONES (2-9, 1-1)

The Centenary women's basketball team went 0-3 throughout the holiday break. In the Comfort Inn Holiday Classic Tournament in Emory, Va, the Cyclones fell to host Emory & Henry (65-74) and Meredith (60-63) in the consolation round. Centenary returned home to welcome Kean where they were defeated (55-61). **Mallory George** led all scorers with 47 points on 14-of-27 shooting and 35 rebounds, while **Nicole Cartaino** added 38 points on the week shooting 15-for-29 and 19 boards. Guard **Rachel Edwards** also chipped in 34 points with four three pointers made. Centenary will now enter conference play as they take to the road and visit Marywood University January 7th @ 6pm in Scranton, PA.

### GWYNEDD MERCY GRIFFINS (5-6, 2-1)

Sophomore **Charlotte Kucowski** was named MVP and senior **Kelsey Yori** was named to the all-tournament team as the Griffins captured their own GM Holiday Tournament this past weekend. On Saturday, Gwynedd defeated Bridgewater State, 54-43, behind 13 points from junior **Olivia Bradford** and seven points and seven rebounds from **Kucowski**. In Sunday's final vs. Trinity (Ct.) **Kucowski** netted a career-high 17 points while **Yori** flirted with a triple-double (nine points, career-high 10 rebounds, seven assists) in the 68-54 victory. GM continues play this week, when they visit Notre Dame on Wednesday and King's on Saturday.

### IMMACULATA MIGHTY MACS (4-6, 2-0)

The Immaculata women's basketball team had a great opportunity to participate in a landmark event at Madison Square Garden as they participated in the Maggie Dixon Classic by facing Queens in a rematch of the first collegiate women's basketball game at the World's Most Famous Arena. The Mighty Macs hung tough with the Division II foe, but fell 76-60. **Sara Smith** led the Mighty Macs with 15 points, while **Reilly Larkin** had 14, and **Adriana Sciascia** had 13. The Mighty Macs led by one early in the second half, but the Knights took control and pulled away late. IU will play their final non-conference game of the season at Penn State-Harrisburg tonight and will go back into CSAC play on Wednesday when they host Rosemont.

### KEYSTONE GIANTS (5-6, 2-0)

Keystone dropped a pair of games over the weekend at the Sleep Inn Holiday Classic hosted by Marywood University. On Saturday, Mount Aloysius overcame a game-high 23-points from **Aaliya Hayes** to defeat the Giants 87-80. **Jerica Rode** added 16 points and eight rebounds in the loss to the Mounties. On Sunday against King's, **Hayes** again led all scorers with 22 points and added 11 rebounds for a double-double, **Ashley Evans** scored 15 points, and **Cierra Hensley** grabbed 10 boards, but the Monarchs used a late field goal to edge the Giants, 67-65. **Hayes** was named to the All-Tournament Team for Keystone, who will host a pair of CSAC games this week, as Cabrini will travel to La Plume on Wednesday evening before the Giants welcome Notre Dame of Maryland on Saturday afternoon.

## AROUND THE CSAC

### MARYWOOD PACERS (6-4, 1-1)

Host Marywood won the Sleep Inn-Dunmore Holiday Classic Jan. 3-4 by winning both games. **Danielle Terranella** was named the Classic's Most Valuable Player and **Maggie Presnal** joined her on the All-Tournament Team. Marywood downed King's in the first game 72-55. The Pacers flexed their down-low presence, outscoring the Monarchs 48-16 in the paint and out-rebounding them 52-30. **Terranella** scored 21 points and **Presnal** had a double-double (13p, 14 r). **Nora Joyce** and **Lindsey Schroth** posted 16 and 15 points, respectively. Marywood defeated Mt. Aloysius 60-53 in the championship. **Tara Steakin** led the Pacers with 11 points. The Pacers participated in Play for Gray to raise money to support King's coach Brian Donaghue and his family in his battle with brain cancer. Marywood hosts Centenary Wednesday.

### NEUMANN KNIGHTS (4-6, 1-1)

Neumann has gone 1-1 to end 2014 and begin 2015. On Tuesday, December 30, Neumann lost to Albright by an 86-64 score. **Lauren Legler** led the Knights with 16 points in her first game as a Knight. Yesterday, the Knights defeated Wilkes in the first round of the Gettysburg Tournament, 58-45. **Jessica Schlesman** led the Knights with 20 points. **JoHanna Metzger** notched a double-double with points and 10 board as well as blocking four shots. Neumann will face Gettysburg on Monday in the Championship game. The Knights then get back to conference action when they host Cairn Wednesday before traveling to Cedar Crest Saturday.

### NOTRE DAME GATORS (3-7, 1-2)

The Gators were idle during the holiday break. This week they return to action as the host Gwynedd Mercy on January 7.

### ROSEMONT RAVENS (2-7, 1-2)

The Ravens shake off the holiday cobwebs as they are scheduled for three games in their opening week schedule of the new year. Rosemont hosts Rutgers-Camden in a non-conference game on Monday night followed by a game at Immaculata on Wednesday. The Ravens will polish off their week on Saturday when they welcome the Marywood Pacers to Alumnae Hall Saturday afternoon in the first game of a doubleheader.
