Keys led the Cavs to a pair of wins last week over Neumann and Immaculata averaging 27 points and 8 rebounds per game. She posted 21 points in 27 minutes in a 95-59 win over the Knights. Keys saved her best game for Cabrini's biggest game, pairing 33 points and 13 boards in a 65-64 victory at Immaculata, a game in which she scored the Cavaliers' final seven points to seal the win.

AROUND THE CSAC

BAPTIST BIBLE DEFENDERS (2-19, 2-13)

The Lady Defenders went 1-1 on the week, including picking up their second win of the season. On Wednesday night, BBC traveled to Cairn University to take on the Highlanders for the second time this season. After falling behind by nine points in the first half, the Lady Defenders made a strong comeback, led by **Simone Lichty's** 19-point performance. She went 5-of-9 from three and the team went 9-of-18 as they picked up the 66-58 win. In Baltimore on Saturday, the Lady Defenders could not get things going in the second half as they were outscored 15-32 in the final twenty minutes and picked up a 27-51 loss. **Coach Jacobs'** squad will finish their season at home Monday night as they host Keystone College at 6:00pm.

CAIRN HIGHLANDERS (2-18, 0-14)

The women's basketball team at Cairn dropped two games this week, first to Baptist Bible 66-58 and then to Keystone 71-31. With the results, the Highlanders fell to 2-18 overall and 0-14 in the conference. Cairn will finish out their season this week by hosting Rosemont on Monday night and traveling to Gwynedd Mercy on Wednesday.

CENTENARY CYCLONES (8-14, 7-6)

The Centenary women's basketball team defeated Rosemont College 83-59 in their lone game this week. The Cyclones were led by **Rachel Edwards** and **Mallory George** as they combined for 46 points. **George** notched her 10th double-double of the season as she grabbed 12 rebounds. With the win, Centenary improved to 8-14 overall and 7-6 in CSAC play. Next up for the Cyclones is a home game versus Marywood University on February 16th @ 7pm.

IMMACULATA MIGHTY MACS (14-8, 11-2)

The Mighty Macs went 1-1 in this week in matchups with two of the top three teams in the league. On Wednesday, Immaculata used a 28-6 run to open the second half to run away with a 75-43 triumph over Gwynedd Mercy to get closer to clinching a bye for the first time in school history in the CSAC postseason. **Brittany Merkle** was dominant with 19 points and 11 rebounds to lead the Macs. On Saturday in a matchup of the top two teams in the CSAC, Immaculata came back from a 10-point deficit in the final four minutes against Cabrini to get within one, but they were unable to take the lead in the final seconds in a 65-64 defeat. **Sara Smith's** lay-up in the final seconds came up just short to seal the Cabrini win. **Adriana Scaiscia** led IU with 18 points. With one more win, IU will seal the No. 2 seed and the bye to the semi-finals. IU will travel to Neumann Monday before hosting Centenary on Wednesday for Senior Night, and then travel to Centenary on Friday.

CABRINI CAVALIERS (21-3, 15-0)

The No. 25 Cavaliers extended their win streak to 15 games with a pair of wins last week over Neumann and Immaculata. With Saturday's win at Immaculata, the Blue and White clinched the top spot in next week's CSAC Tournament. Six Cavaliers scored at least nine points in Wednesday's 95-59 win over Neumann. Senior **Amber Keys** led the way with 21 points, while junior **Meghan Martin** added a career high 19 points off the bench. Sophomore **Taylor Holmes** also marked a career high with 15 points. On Saturday, the Blue and White fought off a furious late comeback for a 65-64 win at Immaculata. **Keys** posted a career high 33 points, including Cabrini's final seven points of the game to seal the win, and 13 rebounds. **Holmes** added 11 points, while senior **Megan Decker** added nine points, six boards and four steals. Cabrini will close its regular season tonight, as it hosts Gwynedd Mercy for Senior Night.

CEDAR CREST FALCONS (5-19, 4-12)

The Cedar Crest College basketball team finished this past week 0-2 overall with an 0-2 CSAC record. The Falcons would drop a close contest to Notre Dame (MD) 57-54 and Gwynedd Mercy 73-41. The Falcons will play one final game on Monday 2/16 against Valley Forge University. Senior **Breonna Lewis** continues to lead the Falcons averaging 12.1 points per game and 8.3 rebounds per game. Sophomore guard **Taylor Osley** is currently second on the team in scoring, averaging 7.8 points per game.

GWYNEDD MERCY GRIFFINS (14-8, 10-3)

The Griffins went 1-1 last week with their lone loss on Wednesday at Immaculata, which snapped a four-game win streak. Senior **Natasha Matthews** was the bright spot in the 75-43 loss to the Mighty Macs, as she scored 11 points (on 4-of-9 shooting) and added three boards, two blocks and a steal. On Saturday, her 13 points, nine rebounds, along with two more blocks helped GM to a 73-41 win over Cedar Crest. Freshman **Dee Terry** would add 15 points off the bench while sophomore **Charlotte Kucowski** pulled down 12 rebounds. Gwynedd has three games this week and is still looking for a #2 playoff seed and first-round bye. On Monday, they'll head to Cabrini to square off with the league-leading Cavaliers. On Wednesday, Cairn visits before Friday's re-scheduled game with Marywood in the home finale.

KEYSTONE GIANTS (12-12, 9-6)

Keystone cruised to a 95-41 win on Monday at Cedar Crest while having five players reach double-figures: **Alyssa Cuomo** (20), **Aaliya Hayes** (18), **Ashley Evans** (12), **Jerica Rode** (11), and **Jazmyn Robinson** (10). On Wednesday, the Giants suffered a 78-72 setback to Rosemont despite getting 18 points apiece from **Hayes** and **Cuomo** while Robinson added a double-double on 17 points and 10 assists. Keystone closed the week with a 71-31 victory over Cairn on Senior Day. **Evans** led all players with 14 points while **Cuomo** added 12 points in the win. Keystone will close out the regular season on Monday at Baptist Bible and can lock up their second conference playoff berth in the last three seasons with a win.

AROUND THE CSAC

MARYWOOD PACERS (14-8, 9-4)

Marywood began a stretch of four CSAC away games to close the season this past week. Following a loss to Lebanon Valley Wednesday, the Pacers earned a key victory over Neumann on the road. The Pacers fell short to LVC 76-59; a comeback became unhinged in the final five minutes. **Maggie Presnal** scored 12 points for the Pacers. Marywood never trailed after the first four minutes in a 62-48 win over Neumann. **Lindsey Schroth** led the way with 17 points. **Maddie Lavery** secured a double-double with 10 points, 10 rebounds. Marywood travels to Centenary Monday, Notre Dame Wednesday and Gwynedd Mercy Friday.

NEUMANN KNIGHTS (10-13, 7-7)

Neumann went 0-2 in a pair of conference games. On Wednesday, Neumann fell to No. 25 Cabrini by a 95-59 score. **Sarah Roberts** led the Knights with 14 points. On Saturday, Neumann fell to Marywood 62-48. **Jessica Schlesman** led the Knights with 17 points. The Knights host conference rival Immaculata on Monday for their final home game of the regular season. The Knights will then travel to conference opponent Rosemont for the regular season finale on Wednesday.

NOTRE DAME GATORS (7-16, 4-11)

Notre Dame finished the past week 2-0 in CSAC action. On Wednesday, the Gators traveled to Cedar Crest for their last road trip of the season, claiming a 57-54 victory over the Falcons. In the win, Notre Dame saw four Gators notch double-figures in scoring, including **Zaria Comer** who recorded her ninth double-double of the season with 15 points and 13 rebounds. On Saturday, Notre Dame hosted Baptist Bible in their annual Pink Game, securing a 51-27 victory. Freshman **Allyson Whitacre** paced the Gators with 14 points, shooting 7-7 from the FT line. The Gators' two wins this week mark the first back-to-back CSAC wins for the program since 2009. Notre Dame will host Marywood Wednesday Feb. 18 on Senior Day.

ROSEMONT RAVENS (11-12, 7-7)

Senior captain **Liz Coyne** has set the all-time scoring record for the CSAC/PAC Conference(s). Her 15 points against Centenary on Saturday gave her a career total of 2,078 points, topping the standing record of 2,077 held by Melissa Posse of Cabrini between 1995-1999. The Ravens were 1-1 in the conference last week, repelling a comeback attack at Keystone, but dropped a game to Centenary at Alumnae Hall. The Ravens, determined to earn a postseason playoff berth, are scheduled to face Cairn in Langhorne on Monday before ending their season on Senior Night against Neumann on Wednesday.
