**CSAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

**TONY MCCRAW**  
 Gwynedd Mercy Univ.  
 Jr.—M—Lawnton, Pa.



McCraw enjoyed an outstanding week, netting nine goals and adding four assists, along with 22 groundballs while hitting his 100th career point in a 2-0 week. He started off on Wednesday with five goals, an assist, seven GB's and went a perfect 6-for-6 on face-offs in an 11-2 win. He followed that up with four goals, three assists, 15 groundballs and went 12-of-20 on face-offs in a 15-6 win at DeSales. His seven points helped him become the fifth player in program history to hit the century mark.

**MIKE LEYDEN**

Leyden led the Cavaliers with 12 points on seven goals and five assists. The senior posted 2 goals and an assist in a loss to No. 15 Salisbury, before recording two goals and a helper in a win at No. 3 Stevenson. Leyden added a season high six points on three goals and three assists to lead Cabrini's comeback in an 11-9 loss to Nazareth.

**ZACH BOWE**  
 Rosemont College—M—So.—West Chester, Pa.

Bowe had a standout week for the Ravens. At Alvernia, he won the first 13 straight face-offs to put the Ravens in a favorable position throughout the game. He continued to show his skills in the center when, on Saturday, he won all 18 face-offs when he was sent to the circle. He ended the week with a remarkable faceoff win percentage of .941. His four goals against Keystone set a career-high for Bowe. He also played a strong game after the face-offs, scoring a total of five goals with two assists this week in helping the Ravens win consecutive games for the first time in the program's short history.





## AROUND THE CSAC



**CABRINI COLLEGE**  
4-3, 0-0 CSAC

The No. 10 Cavaliers fell to 4-4 on the season, after posting a 1-2 week. Despite two goals and an assist from seniors **Mike Leyden** and **Tyler Johnston**, Cabrini fell behind early in a 13-7 loss to No. 15 Salisbury on Wednesday. The Blue and White rallied on Saturday night, as it scored an 8-6 win at No. 3 Stevenson. **Johnston** posted five points and joined **Leyden**, senior **Damian Sobieski** and junior **Ethan Heisman** with two goals each. The Cavaliers couldn't carry their momentum into Sunday's game against Nazareth, as they fell behind 9-0 in the first half. **Leyden's** three goals and three assists led the second half comeback, which fell just short in the 11-9 loss. Cabrini will open CSAC play on Tuesday, with a trip to Centenary before visiting No. 13 Ithaca on Saturday.

The men's lacrosse team fell to Whittier College 6-4 in their lone game this week. **Trevor Krupinski** led the offense with two goals, while **Anthony Biango** and **Michael Balsamo** added a goal each. The Cyclones open conference play against Cabrini March 24th at 4pm.



**GWYNEDD MERCY UNIVERSITY**

The Griffins went 2-0 last week, winning both games by an average of nine goals. On Wednesday, the defense yielded just two goals in an 11-2 win over Delaware Valley. Junior **Tony McCraw** would finish with five goals and a helper while **Blase Cesarone** added three. **McCraw** stayed hot in Saturday's 16-5 win at DeSales, registering four scores and three assists. The team begins CSAC play this week on Wednesday when Immaculata visits before a date at Centenary on Saturday.

The Mighty Mac men's lacrosse team went 1-1 this week to grab their first win on the young season. On Wednesday, the Macs lost on the road at Bryn Athyn, 17-11, despite a career-high four goals from **Doug Hughes**. IU raced out to a 5-1 lead after the first quarter, but **Bryn Athyn** outscored them 7-2 in the second quarter and never gave back the lead. On Sunday, the Mighty Macs won a thriller at Draper Walsh Stadium, 13-12, in double overtime over Mount Saint Vincent for their first victory of the season. Freshman **Brendan Doyle** took a pass from freshman **Mike Reardon** 1:05 into the second extra session and scored while falling to the ground to give Immaculata the dramatic win. **Reardon** had eight points on three goals and five assists, while **Tyler Black** and **Ben Lerario** each scored three goals. The Macs will open CSAC play this week with road games at Gwynedd Mercy and Marywood.

The team is scheduled for two non-conference games this week starting on Wednesday at Misericordia and on Friday against FDU-Florham (to be played at The Haverford School).
