**CABRINI COLLEGE**  
4-4, 2-0 CSAC

The Cavaliers extended its win streak to four games and evened its record at 4-4 with a pair of CSAC wins last week. Cabrini opened league play with an 18-7 win at Gwynedd Mercy. Seniors **Sarah Means** and **Lacie Doubet**, junior **Sarah Carzo** and sophomore **Allie Vallen** each recorded hat tricks, while senior **Melissa Scanzano** paired two goals and an assist to surpass the 200 career point plateau. On Saturday, the Blue and White recorded its first shutout in two years with a 16-0 win over Keystone. Fourteen Cavaliers marked the scoring column, including 12 who scored at least one goal in the win. **Doubet** led the way with three goals and an assist, while **Scanzano** and **Carzo** tallied two goals and a helper each. Cabrini will return to action on Wednesday, when it visits Neumann in a rematch of the last two CSAC championship games. The Cavaliers will also host Rowan on Friday and Cedar Crest on Saturday.

In the game IU scored the first 10 goals, and the final seven goals as they were in complete control for their CSAC opening victory. **Lapp** had five goals and two assists for a team-high seven points, while **Jakavick** and senior **Danielle Lopez** each had four goals apiece.
