## CSAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**TONY MCCRAW**  
**GWYNEDD MERCY UNIV.**  
**Jr.—A/M—Lawnton, Pa.**



McCraw totaled seven points each in two games, totaling seven goals and seven assists in a pair of CSAC wins. McCraw was also 16-of-21 on face-offs while adding nine ground balls and three caused turnovers. In Wednesday's win over Immaculata, McCraw tallied three goals, four assists with five GB's, a CT while winning 8-of-10 face-offs. He would follow that up with four goals and three assists along with four GB's, a pair of caused TO's and won 8-of-11 draws in the win at Centenary.

Strope led Keystone to the team's first two wins in program history by recording nine points on eight goals and one assist in the Giants' 2-0 week. The freshman midfielder scored three goals and added an assist in Keystone's first-ever win, a 12-6 victory over SUNY Cobleskill Wednesday. Strope then scored five goals to lead the Giants to their first-ever CSAC win on Saturday, 12-8 over Neumann. Strope also went 14-20 (70 percent) on face-offs on the week and led the squad with 13 ground balls.

Slater scored seven goals to lead Marywood to a pair of CSAC victories over Neumann and Immaculata. Slater totaled a hat trick and three ground balls in a 17-3 victory over Neumann Tuesday. He followed that up by scoring four goals in a 17-2 win over Immaculata Saturday.





## AROUND THE CSAC



**CABRINI COLLEGE**  
5-5, 1-0 CSAC

The Cavaliers split a pair of games last week, topping Centenary 9-4 before falling 9-8 at No. 14 Ithaca. Senior **Mike Leyden** paired two goals and two assists, while junior **Ethan Heisman** added two goals and a helper to give the Blue and White its 88th consecutive CSAC win on Tuesday. **Leyden** tallied three goals and an assist, while senior **Tyler Johnston** and junior **Cole Campbell** recorded three points each in Cabrini's loss at Ithaca. The Blue and White will turn its full attention to CSAC play, as it welcomes Gwynedd Mercy to campus on Wednesday.



**CENTENARY COLLEGE**

The Centenary men's lacrosse team went 0-2 on the week with losses to Cabrini College (9-4) and Gwynedd Mercy (10-2). The Cyclones are now 1-7 overall and 0-2 in league play. Centenary duo, **Michael Muff** and **Trevor Krupinski** led the Cyclone offense with a pair of goals each against the Cavaliers and a goal against Gwynedd. Keeper, **Kevin Switzer** tallied a total 47 saves on the week. Centenary looks to get back into the win column as they face Drew University March 31st at 4pm.

8-2, 2-0 CSAC

The Griffins went 2-0 in CSAC play last week, picking up wins over Immaculata on Wednesday and Centenary on Saturday. In win over Immaculata on Wednesday, the Griffins held a 6-1 lead after the first en route to a 15-1 win. Senior **Nico Belardo** tied a program single-game mark with eight points on three goals and five assists. Junior **Tony McCraw** added three scores and four helpers while **Blase Cesarone** chipped in three goals of his own. In Saturday's 10-2 win at Centenary, the Griffin defense held the Cyclones scoreless for the first three quarters and **McCraw** would again register seven points in the victory. Junior **Tommy Belmont** also added three goals.

COLLEGE**  
2-4, 1-1 CSAC

Keystone won the first game in program history on Wednesday with a 12-6 victory over SUNY Cobleskill before picking up their first-ever CSAC win on Saturday, 12-8 over Neumann to cap off a 2-0 week. **Michael Bradley** scored four goals and had two assists while **Patrick Hash** and **Caleb Strobe** had four points apiece in the win over the Fighting Tigers. **Strobe** scored five goals and **Cullen Smith** added four points against the Knights. **Matthew Grobelny** posted 36 saves on the week including 23 against Neumann. Keystone will be idle this coming week before returning to action on Wednesday, April 8th at Immaculata.



**MARYWOOD  
UNIVERSITY**  
5-3, 2-0 CSAC

Marywood posted two lopsided victories over conference opponents to extend its winning streak to four games. The Pacers downed Immaculata 17-2 Saturday. Marywood scored the first 11 goals of the game en route to its largest victory in two seasons. **Sam Trill** broke the school career goals record with his 106th, 107th score. The Pacers won 19 of 22 faceoff opportunities, led by **Riley Litman's** 16 wins. **Scott Slater** scored four goals, and **Dylan Swope** tallied a goal and five assists. Marywood posted its largest road victory since 2010 with a 17-3 win over Neumann Tuesday. **Slater, Swope** and **Matt Casto** each had three point performances. **Michael Squillante** collected 12 ground balls. Marywood honored 13 players during its Senior Day Saturday. The Pacers host Susquehanna Tuesday, in a rivalry that has seen the past two games settled by one goal, in their only game of the week.
