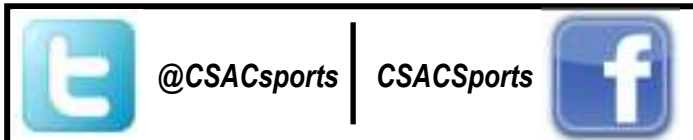

BAPTIST BIBLE COLLEGE DEFENDERS (1-7, 0-2 CSAC)



With the crazy weather conditions, the Lady Defender softball team was only able to get in one double header this past week, as they were swept on the road by Immaculata University. The Mighty Macs took game one by a score of 12-3 and the second game by a score of 12-4. **Ashley Snare** and **Lauren Shepherd** both recorded multi-hit games, while senior **Jenna Bont** not only had multiple hits, but also recorded 2 RBIs. The team will host Rosemont College on Tuesday, followed by hosting King's College (PA) on Wednesday.

CABRINI COLLEGE CAVALIERS (6-4, 2-0 CSAC)



The Blue and White improved to 6-4 overall and 2-0 in the conference after topping Eastern 6-5 and 8-4. The Cavaliers were down 5-0 in the first game but battled back to capture the win. Junior **Kaitlyn Cooper** hit two three run home runs, including a walk-off shot to left center in the first game to complete the comeback. Freshman **Jess Giordano** earned her second win on the year after throwing three innings and surrendering three runs on four hits. The Blue and White came out hot in the second game, scoring seven unanswered runs through four innings. Senior **Steph Diegel** ended with four RBI, including a three run home run in the third inning. Six other cavaliers tallied a hit in the win. Freshman **Kaitlyn Hohman** pitched six innings, surrendered three runs and allowed just five hits in the win. The Cavaliers will host Rosemont today in a doubleheader at Cabrini Field before the team heads to Immaculata on Wednesday.

CAIRN UNIVERSITY HIGHLANDERS (0-12, 0-4 CSAC)



The Highlanders lost four games this past week, two to Penn State Abington (5-3, 15-0) and two to Cedar Crest College (4-3, 7-4). Cairn led most of the way in game one against Cedar Crest but were overtaken in the seventh inning on a walk-off hit by the Falcons. With the losses, Cairn dropped to 0-12 overall and 0-4 in the CSAC. Cairn will have two away doubleheaders this week against Arcadia University and Franklin & Marshall College.

CEDAR CREST COLLEGE FALCONS (3-7, 2-0 CSAC)



The Cedar Crest College Softball team finished the week 2-0 with a clean sweep of CSAC foe Cairn. GWYNEDD MERCY UNIVERSITY GRIFFINS (6-4, 1-1 CSAC)



The Griffins were back in action for the first time in 24 days, splitting a CSAC DH at Marywood on Sunday. In game one, Gwynedd fell behind 5-1 early, but came up short in a 5-3 loss. Junior **Megan Kelly** had three hits while senior **Jen Whalen** scored twice. In game two, it was the Griffins getting off to a good start, with two in the first and three in the fourth. **Whalen** would go 3-for-5 with an RBI, run, and stolen base while freshman **Tara Matteo** added three hits and an RBI. GMercyU hosts Keystone on Monday and Notre Dame on Wednesday in rescheduled games.

IMMACULATA UNIVERSITY MIGHTY MACS (2-8, 2-0 CSAC)



The Mighty Macs ended their three-week lay-off by going 2-2 this past week in doubleheaders against Wesley and Baptist Bible. IU lost the first game to Wesley, 8-0, and then raced out to a 6-0 lead through two innings of the second game, but Wesley stormed back to tie the game 8-8 before scoring two late runs to deal the Macs a 10-8 defeat. On Wednesday, IU finally started CSAC play and they swept Baptist Bible in a doubleheader, 12-3 and 12-4. Freshman **Annemarie Bartow** had a great day going 5-for-7 with two home runs, a double, a triple, and five RBIs. **Melissa Ejk** had seven RBIs, including a grand slam in the victories. **Caitlin Brasier** and **Meghan Kugler** each picked up their first wins of the season in the circle. This week, the Mighty Macs will travel to Widener on Tuesday before hosting Cabrini on Wednesday.

KEYSTONE COLLEGE GIANTS (2-4, 0-0 CSAC)
