Interrelationship of building and surroundings: The property is a .3-acre site on the east side of John Street, south of the downtown section of Hartford. The site abuts the rear of 197 Main Street, the Engine Company 1 Fire Station, with which it formerly was a single parcel.

Other notable features of building or site: Two-story red brick industrial-type building with simple Neo-classical revival-style details including a symmetrical four-bay facade, central pediment flanked by corner piers. Windows are multi-pane industrial sash.

Listed on the National Register as part of the Firehouses of Hartford Multiple Property Submission.

Architect: Ebbets and Frid Builder/Maker: Unknown

Historical or Architectural importance:

The building was built in 1920 as a maintenance facility for motorized fire-fighting equipment, which had by then replaced horse-drawn vehicles. By the early 1990s it was unused, and was sold to Lightspace LLC, to become the Walter Wick Studios. Wick created elaborate sets and optical illusions which he photographed for Games magazine, for the I Spy books which he created with author Jean Marzollo, and other books during the next two decades.

Walter Wick (b. 1953) grew up in the Granby area, and studied art and photography at Paier College of Art in Hamden. Wick worked as a landscape photographer before beginning his association with Games magazine and with Scholastic Publishing, who have published his work since the 1990s.
