### Interrelationship of building and surroundings:

The O. E. Willard Lumber Company business occupies the block frontage along Valley Street between Walnut and Bank Streets. At the west end of the block, the property extends through to Meadow Street. At the east end, it abuts a city-owned parking lot. The surrounding area is a mix of religious, social service, residential, and commercial uses.

#### Other notable features of building or site:

A one-story flat-roofed commercial building at 190 Valley Street is the primary retail store for the O.E. Willard Company. It has multi-paned modern storefront windows and entry doors facing Valley Street and an entry from a parking lot on the east side. A 2 ½-story gable-roofed building next door to the west, at 196 Valley Street belongs to the business as well. This has a brick north façade and the remainder appears to be of frame construction, with some twelve-over-twelve wood sash windows on its side elevations, and asphalt roofing. Along the east and west sides of this building are one-story open-sided lumber sheds with metal industrial siding. The west wall facing Walnut Street is the painted with murals of various locations in Willimantic, and is the work of artist Arnold Prince.

#### **Historical or Architectural importance:**

The Willard Company buildings include a pair of buildings dating to the c. 1900 period of Willimantic's industrial dominance, now surrounded by a collection of twentieth-century storage sheds. The company has been a family business in Willimantic and Storrs since the 1920s. The Willard Company welcomed artist Arnold Prince to paint an 18-foot high by 100-foot long mural with scenes of Willimantic, on the blank west wall of their storage shed, running a full block along Walnut Street. For this, Prince received an award from 'Quiet Corner' magazine for community enhancement.

Arnold Prince (1925-2014) was a native of St. Kitts, in the British West Indies, who came to the United States to study at the Art Students League in the 1950s. He began teaching at a high school in Harlem. He taught sculpture at Rhode Island School of Design, at North Adams

State College in Massachusetts and at Eastern Connecticut State University in Willimantic. He wrote the book 'Carving Wood and Stone, an Illustrated Manual,' published in 1981, and often used as a textbook. He lived and worked in Chaplin with his wife, Claudia Widdiss, also a sculptor and teacher.
