MARION WIESEL, widely acclaimed translator and Jewish communal leader, has, since her marriage, translated all of her husband's works from the French into English: Souls on Fire, The Oath, Messengers of God, A Jew Today, Somewhere a Master, The Trial of God. Marion Wiesel has adapted Zalman, the Madness of God for the stage and for television. She is currently translating Wiesel's latest novel, The Fifth Son.

SAMUEL H. DRESNER, Rabbi of Moriah Congregation, Deerfield, Illinois, has had a long, exemplary career as communal leader, Jewish activist, and teacher and scholar in Judaic Studies. With a primary interest in the world of Hasidism, his publications include The Zaddik (1960) and Levi Yitzhak of Berdichev: Portrait of a Hasidic Master (1974). He has also devoted much effort to the study of the works of Abraham Joshua Heschel, the eminent philosopher of Judaism, who was Rabbi Dresner's teacher and mentor.

DAVID WEINSTEIN, Chancellor of Spertus College of Judaica, has provided devoted, energetic leadership to the College for the past twenty years. He pioneered the establishment of a unique consortium of Illinois colleges and universities for Judaic Studies, providing a model for other comparable institutions to replicate.
