THE CANTERBURY MEDAL

The Canterbury Medal is the Becket Fund's highest honor. It recognizes courage in the defense of religious liberty and is named for Canterbury Cathedral, where Thomas à Becket was martyred by the knights of King Henry II for his own defense of religious freedom. The Canterbury Medal is thus given annually to leading figures that champion a vigorous role for religious ideas in the public square.

ARMANDO VALLADARES

New York Times best-selling author, poet, artist & former prisoner of conscience



rmando Valladares is a Aformer political prisoner who spent 22 years in Castro's gulags for refusing to place a sign on his desk in support of Fidel. He was sentenced to 30 years in prison without due process. While in prison he became a "Plantado"-a prisoner who refuses to wear a common prison uniform. For refusing to sign a document admitting he was wrong and the Revolution was right, he was brutally tortured, spent 8 years in solitary confinement

and underwent several hunger strikes which left him paralyzed for many years. During this time, he wrote numerous poems which his wife smuggled out of Cuba and had published to critical acclaim. Valladares was adopted by Amnesty International as a prisoner of conscience.

In 1982, Valladares was released thanks to an international campaign on his behalf. Upon release, he wrote a New York Times best-selling memoir, Against All Hope, which was translated into 18 languages.

In 1986 he was named U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Human Rights Commission where he was able to highlight the plight of the more than 15,000 political prisoners in Cuba at the time. In 1989, for the first time ever since the Cuban revolution, the Castro regime was forced to open its doors to a UN investigation. The resulting report was devastating for the regime and culminated with the release of many political prisoners. Valladares continues to advocate for human rightsparticularly religious libertyand lives with his wife in Florida where he continues to writes poetry, paint and sculpt. He has three adult children and one granddaughter.


Christie earned her degree at Michigan's Ferris State University and pursued a career as a paralegal in Boston and New York City. Over the past 25 years, Christie has devoted herself to her most important mission, raising the couple's three children, Kaley, Ted and CJ. Christie also possesses a powerful commitment to Catholic social action. She served as a Member of the Boards of St. Elizabeth's Home School Association and Don Bosco Preparatory High School. She has led the Pro-Life Ministry and organized trips to the March for Life in Washington, D.C., for her home parish, St. Elizabeth's. Christie shares her time and talents with HIV/AIDS sufferers living in New Jersey's Harrison House, women and children at Several Sources Women's Shelter, and St. Martin's Soup Kitchen in Jersey City.

Christie and Tony are members of The Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem and Stewards of St. Peter in The Papal Foundation.

Tribute to the Medalist

Elie Wiesel

Holocaust survivor, best-selling author & Nobel Laureate



Tie Wiesel was born in 1928 Lin Sighet, Transylvania, which is now part of Romania. He was fifteen years old when he and his family were deported by the Nazis to Auschwitz, His mother and younger sister perished, his two older sisters survived. Elie and his father were later transported to Buchenwald, where his father died shortly before the camp was liberated in April 1945. After the war, Elie Wiesel studied in Paris and later became a journalist. During an interview with the distinguished French writer, Francois Mauriac, he was

persuaded to write about his experiences in the death camps. The result was his internationally acclaimed memoir, Night (La Nuit), which has since been translated into more than thirty languages.

In 1978, President Jimmy Carter appointed Elie Wiesel as Chairman of the President's Commission on the Holocaust. In 1980, he became the Founding Chairman of the United States Holocaust Memorial Council. He is President of The Elie Wiesel Foundation for Humanity, an organization he and his wife created to fight indifference, intolerance and injustice. Elie Wiesel has received more than 100 honorary degrees from institutions of higher learning.

Elie Wiesel is the author of more than sixty books of fiction and non-fiction, including A Beggar in Jerusalem (Prix Médicis winner), The Testament (Prix Livre Inter winner), The Fifth Son (winner of the Grand Prize in Literature from the City of Paris), two volumes of his memoirs, All Rivers Run to the Sea and And the Sea is Never Full, and most recently The Sonderberg Case.

For his literary and human rights activities, he has received numerous awards including the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the U.S. Congressional Gold Medal, the National Humanities Medal, the Medal of Liberty, the rank of Grand-Croix in the French Legion of Honor. In 1986, Elie Wiesel won the Nobel Prize for Peace.

ristina Arriaga de Bucholz Adeveloped her lifelong passion for freedom from her exiled Cuban American parents. Executive Director since 2010, she leads a team of lawyers and communications professionals who defend our first freedom in the US and abroad. Kristina first joined the Becket Fund in 1995, bringing many years of experience in the fight for liberty.

After starting her career in DC working for US Ambassador José Sorzano at the Cuban American National Foundation. she became an advisor to

the US delegation to the UN **Human Rights Commission** (UNHRC). Splitting her time between the seat of the UNHRC in Geneva and Washington, D.C., Kristina worked on raising awareness of the plight of political prisoners with New York Times bestselling author, former political prisoner, Armando Valladares who was named Ambassador to the UN.

After returning permanently to the US. Kristina continued to work on behalf of defectors and refugees. Her work orchestrating the spectacular airplane rescue of a defector's

family from Cuba earned her recognition in media all over the world including Reader's Digest and Vanity Fair.

No less adventurous was her time working on domestic affairs as an Intergovernmental Relations Officer at the Department of Housing and Urban Development where she reported to former Ohio Secretary of State, J. Kenneth Blackwell and Secretary Jack Kemp and then later as a four-year appointee to the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights.

In between swapping hats at the Becket Fund, she has had the greatest adventure of all: she is happily married and has three kids

Kristina obtained her undergraduate degree at Marquette University and her Master's Degree at Georgetown University where she graduated summa cum laude.



Since his ordination in 1996 he has served as parochial vicar at Saint Bernadette, Saint Patrick, and Saint Rita parishes. written for various publications and is a regular contributor to the Arlington Catholic Herald and Encourage and Teach on the diocesan website. He is also a frequent speaker for the Institute of Catholic Culture in Front Royal.

Quorum of the Twelve Apostles, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints



Elder Gary E. Stevenson
was named an Apostle of
The Church of Jesus Christ of
Latter-day Saints on October
3, 2015. At the time of his call,
Elder Stevenson was serving
as the Presiding Bishop of the
Church since March 2012 and
previously served in the First
Quorum of the Seventy, to
which he was called in 2008.

Elder Stevenson says he has spent much of his life observing the essential work bishops perform across the globe. His father, he said, was "the bishop of my youth, and his service deeply impacted me." On many occasions, Elder Stevenson's father would invite him along on visits to one of the more than 30 widows living in their ward. From his father, Bishop Stevenson learned lessons about Christ-like service and caring for those in need. Those lessons, he said, served him well in his calling as the Presiding Bishop of the Church.

Born on August 6, 1955, to Evan N. and Vera Jean Stevenson, Elder Stevenson grew up in Utah's Cache Valley in a family that came of pioneer stock. While a young man, he accepted a call to serve a mission to Japan. That assignment instilled in Elder Stevenson a dual love for Asia and for sharing the gospel that has lasted a lifetime.

After returning from his mission, he enrolled at Utah State University, It was there he met (and was immediately smitten by) Lesa Jean Higley. The two married in April 1979 in the Idaho Falls Idaho Temple, The Stevensons have four sons. While at Utah State, Elder Stevenson obtained a degree in business administration. He later cofounded and served as president of an exercise equipment manufacturing company. He has served in a variety of Church callings, including counselor in a stake presidency, bishop, and president of the Japan Nagoya Mission (2004-07). He was called as a General Authority Seventy in 2008 and served as a counselor and president in the Asia North Area.




