The National Committee on American Foreign Policy, Inc. was founded in 1974 by Professor Hans J. Morgenthau and others to serve as a nonprofit, independent foreign policy organization and educational forum to promote interest in and understanding of the U.S. role in world affairs.

The National Committee initiates a range of programs and research projects, whose findings are shared with key government officials and the American public. Its fact-finding missions, symposia, and position papers on vital foreign policy programs have led to greater public appreciation and understanding of U.S. interests throughout the world.

The National Committee's Hans J. Morgenthau Award is presented to an individual whose exceptional efforts have contributed to the advancement of the national interests of the United States and to the achievement of U.S. foreign policy objectives within the framework of political realism. Established in 1981, one year after Professor Morgenthau's death, it has been presented on only ten previous occasions. Honorees have been Angier Biddle Duke, Sol Linowitz, Henry Kissinger, Jean Kirkpatrick, George Shultz, David Rockefeller, James Baker III, Lady Margaret Thatcher, Thomas Pickering, and His Majesty King Hussein.
