family and every thing around is plenty, comfort, and cheerfulness

yet the want of health deprives her of enjoyment. Canon speaks of you with the greatest affection and says she wishes you were here to enjoy the sweets of the country which are great indeed. The Baltimoreans have been extremely attentive to me & have made many new acquaintances, <sup>on</sup> Saturday I returned many of my visitors many whom I have not seen, she left home on Thursday and expects to be about a much longer time than I hope I shall. I long wish for that happiness of being there. This was the day I determined on leaving this place but alas! that expectation is frustrated. It will I pray be but a few days longer so soon as I can either leave Grace in health, or bring him home with me I shall embrace the earliest period very much I shall spend on Grace's own inclination if he wishes to remain at Oakland and it will be advised so to do, I shall make no objection to his wishes if on the contrary I shall return as soon as it will be advisable his fatigue was excessive on the journey down to Baltimore the accommodation in the steam boat though good deprived him of sleep which was severe on him, in his delicate health do not my dear Becky let this letter be seen by my dear husband to keep up his spirits in my absence is a great
