My dear Sisters Sally, Becky, and Rachel will I hope indulge me with addressing them Jointly althogh not [coinsidint] to my wishes am obligd to repeat the request \_ the goodness and attention of my dear Sisters I sinsibly feall and experien[ce] individually the Beautys of your minds, which I cannot sufficiently admire nor do Justice to; am sorry you my dear girls have so dull a correspondent in me but you who possess do much goodness I hope will make allowances I am too domestic to be intelligent or [...] facetious I wish you would come and see me and I will endevour to be clever \_as [Mr Spear] says, (Rachel) I am only clever in my own home uncles illness I imagine prevented you attending to your dancing no doubt you [...?] pleasure from the immusement I heard Sally Etting say she was much offendd with my [Sister] Sally as she feals her self much neglected by her from my dr. Becky I saw a letter to [...?] the other day which alleviated my anxious mind \_ my Rachel I believe does not neglect her Baltimore friends you would be amaisd my dear at the [end of page]

improvement of our city and when you again visit us I hope you will be happier is Mr. [Hanes?] yet irrivd his wife is much to be pittyd poor woman in her husbands absence she must be truely wreatched \_ I wish my dear girls you would let me know as soon as possible how our dear Richeas child is I am very anxious about it, I wish my Sisters you could see my sweet gratz and isabella the Bearer of this which is Naph Phillips can tell you of the goodness of the latter but was he to assert it you would suppose it m...d ... she goes out very often and is much admired [wares?] a little pink sattin Bonnet which she looks sweet in Mr Etting thinks her the image of my sister Rachel \_ though I must confess I cannot trace a likeness Sally [Docherty?] wishes me to say a great deal for her therfore do accept her Love my dear Blessd Reuben gives a great deal of Love to you all do my dear Sister write to me soon let me know any thing and every thing [...?] to the family as that is all I [care] for tell me they are well and I am Blessd kiss my sweet little Brothers for me I send [end of page]
