We heard by Mr. Moses of your arrival in New York, and give you due credit for your studious disposition, your forbearance in leaving the pleasures of traveling, and all your other wise & good motives for returning, add to these the pleasure we anticipate in seeing you again, and the desire of our dear Mother to embrace her darling, and I hope you will feel yourself rewarded for the good resolution which has brought you thus near home _

I lament that all things do not conspire to render your meeting as joyous as it might be as our honored Mother, has been for some days past quite an invalid, in consequence of a very sore Bile on her neck, which has given her a great deal of pain, and continues still to do so _ but we trust in God, who cures all sores, for her resto-ration, and I am sure, nothing will tend to cheer her so much, and of course cheet her of her pain [end of page]

as your arrival _ all the rest of the family enjoy health, and expect great pleasure from seeing you and hearing of your travels, I have not yet said how much gratified I felt on recieving your letter, but I hope my Dear Brother, you will believe that it really did afford me as much pleasure, as you could have wished, when you were bestowing your Kindness on me _ and tho' I have little hopes of your recieving this, could not refuse my self the pleasure of discharging the debt your goodness laid me under _ our Mother & Sisters send you their affectionate love _ remember me to our friends you are with _ & believe me My dear Ben most cordially & sincerely your affectionate
