

- 4 How was an interview form a subject one-general or removast used to enhance the subject matter of the documentary?



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

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Filming Protocols in Action

To understand how the Filming Protocols work to guide you through the storytelling process, you will rewatch the short documentary as a production group and respond to the following prompts which reflect the questions you will answer as you complete your short documentary.

- Create a logline for the short documentary you just viewed.
- 2. Identify the central message of the story.
- Identify a compelling shot from the short documentary. Note the shot size and scale, in addition to any other visual notes.
- 4. Identify the transition into Act II and Act III of the short documentary.
- Create a one-day production schedule that features all the components of the short documentary you saw featured (Ex. Interviews, B-Roll, Scenes, etc.)


