Reflect Back: Production VS Post-Production


- **Production is** the process by which a film or motion picture is produced. The process where the story described in a script is actualized with the filming of each scene depicted in it
- Post-Production is the stage after production when the filming is complete and the editing of the visual and audio materials begins

Post-production plays a pivotal role in filmmaking, transforming raw video footage into a cohesive narrative by editing the video, mixing sound and adding visual effects.
