The History of Discipline in Schools

Purpose

School suspensions and expulsions disproportionately impact children of color and this harmful trend begins with our youngest learners in preschool (Iruka et. al., 2020). While the "problem" behavior is often blamed on the child, racism is at the root of the issue. This video discusses the introduction of school discipline as a direct result of school integration.
