- e. A day of sorrow and darkness; like a thief in the night Joel 1:15, 2:1-2, 9-11
- f. The sign of this day Joel 2:31
- g. It is a day of darkness Amos 5:18-20
- h. It is a day of wrath and judgment Zeph 1:14-15
- i. There is hope; they can be hid from it Zeph 2:2-3
- j. A day of unquenchable fire Mat 3:11-12, Mal 3:1-3, 4:1
- k. Watch and pray to be accounted worthy to escape Luke 21:36
- I. They will pray Psalm 23 as they go through the valley of the shadow

- f. A day of glory and blessing Col 3:4, Titus 2:13, Rom 8:18
- g. A day of redemption of our bodies Eph 4:30
- h. Delivered from the wrath to come 1 Thess 1:10
- i. Not a day of sorrow, a day of comfort 1 Thess 4:13, 16-18

4. Prophecy in the Dispensation of Grace

- a. Ye have no need, because the Day of the Lord is not the mystery of Christ
- b. You are not in darkness or of the night 1 Thess 5:3-9
- c. Day of the Lord concerns judgment, followed by Israel's restitution Rom 11:25-27
