Paul on Trial - Part 08 - Acts 28

Salvation sent to the Gentiles

1. 28:17-22 – "from Jerusalem into the hands of the Romans"

- a. Nothing against the people, nor the customs of our fathers 1 Cor 8:13, 9:20
- b. Prisoner from Jerusalem into Roman hands just as the Lord, only Paul escaped.
- c. Israel did not fall at the Lord's death. Their fall is recorded in Acts mid-Acts.
- d. Peter accused Israel, but Paul did not Acts 2:23; 3:14-15; 4:10-11; 5:30; 7:51-54

2. 28:20-22 - "for the hope of Israel I am bound"

- a. Paul was not bound for offering Israel's kingdom, but for Christ Luke 2:30-32
- b. The hope is the resurrection of Jesus Christ Act 23:6, 24:14, 25:18, 26:6-8
- c. One Lord, one hope which is in Christ = Eph 1:10, 1 Pet 1:3, 1 John 3:3, Rom 11:12

3. 28:23-24 – "concerning Jesus... out of the law... and prophets"

- a. "to his lodging" his custom was to go into their synagogues
- b. "testified the kingdom of God" in both Acts and post Acts Ro 14:17, Col 1:13
- c. "concerning Jesus" not the gospel of the kingdom, or law righteousness
 - i. See Acts 13:16-33 and Romans as an example of justification w/o law.
- d. "out of the law... prophets" Which is how present Christ to a Jew John 5:39, 47
 - i. Most of Paul's epistles address Jews, law, and prophecy Rom 1:1-5, 2:16
 - ii. Romans covers the topics that would be addressed to a mixed crowd
 - iii. Paul writes his epistles concerning mystery truth to believers.

4. 28:25-27 – "Well spake the Holy Ghost by Esaias the prophet"

- a. After all day they departed from Paul Paul confirms Isaiah 6:9-10 was right.
- b. Isa 6:8-13 is God punishing Israel with blindness and hiding salvation Eze 12:2
- c. It is about their knowing the word of the Lord Isa 1:10, 55:3
- d. Remember the song of Moses started with hearing ears Deu 29:2-4 and 32:1
- e. Israel was blind: Mt 11:15, 13:9-17, 37, Mk 7:16, Lk 14:35, Jn 12:37-40
- f. Israel rejected the prophets (John), Jesus, and the Holy Ghost Acts 7:51-54
- g. Israel rejects Paul sent with free salvation to all Acts 13:46, Acts 18:6
- h. Why quote prophecy? Why at the end of the book? A: Acts is about Israel's fall.
- i. Israel is blind even today, salvation still proclaimed is the mystery Rom 11:25

5. 28:28-31 - "salvation of God is sent unto the Gentiles"

- a. God promised to bless the nations through them, but not all Israel Psa 81:10-11
- b. Israel has been blind before, but never has salvation gone to Gentiles Jer 5:20-21
- c. Israel fell before Acts 28, Paul's gospel was preached to them Rom 11:7-13
- d. God goes to Israel with Paul's gospel, but they reject that, too.
- e. "kingdom of God" Israel did not get their kingdom, the church had begun.
- f. Does Acts finish abruptly and unfinished? Only if you think it's about the church
