THE BENEFIT OF THE DOUBT

HOW WE RESPOND TO ACCUSATIONS AGAINST GOD

"let God be true, but every man a liar; as it is written, That thou mightest be justified in thy sayings, and mightest overcome when thou art judged."

~ Romans 3:4

1. When in Doubt ...

- a. Ostriches, 10% of brains, water/electricity, camel humps, bats and blindness.
- b. Not everything you hear/read is true. There are reasons to doubt many things.
- c. "The Bible has many mistakes." "There is no evidence for God." "The Bible is misogynist, racist, violent, unjust, outdated."... what is your response?
- d. Born gay, promiscuity, Bible has mistakes, evolution disproves Bible, etc.
- e. <u>Doubt</u> ~def. To waiver or fluctuate in opinion, to be in uncertainty regarding truth.
- f. When you are in doubt... whose testimony do you believe?

2. The Benefit of the Doubt

- a. A mistake \rightarrow thinking that no one thinks contrary to you. (doubts!!)
- b. Scientists, academics, scholars, professionals, experienced, pope get benefit of truth *i.* "If there is a mistake, they will find it. If they find one, it must be so."
- c. When the choice is between those credible witnesses and God who gets the benefit?
- d. The benefit of the doubt ~def. to decide that you will believe someone, even though you are not sure that what the person is saying is true
- e. Is God more credible than men? Deu 32:4, Ps 119:160, 138:2
 - i. Too hard to believe? Exo 14:22, Isa 34:7, 1 Cor 1:19, 2:14, 3:18
 - ii. Many doubts caused by wrong division, prooftext, numbers, unexplainable.
 - iii. If you come to the book looking to doubt you will find reason.
 - iv. If you come to the book looking to believe you will find reason.
 - v. How to know? Put his words in you Prov 22:18-21, 1 Thess 2:13
 - vi. Don't change his testimony because you don't know the answer!
- f. Give God the benefit of the doubt over scholarship.

3. Accusations and Innocence

- a. If God is not true, then true justice cannot be done.
- b. Accusation ~def. The act of charging with a wrong, injustice, crime, offense.
- c. The Bible → defend the accused. Innocent until proven guilty Deu 19:15-20
 - i. Protecting the credible and innocent Num 35:30, Matt 18:16, 1 Tim 5:19
 - ii. The presence of an accusation (a doubt) does not warrant guilt.
- d. Justice \rightarrow It is the accused that should be protected by law/trial, not the accuser.
- e. Letting God be true, means the accusations are tried Rom 3:4, Job 40:8, John 3:33
- f. God is innocent. God is true. All the accusations and claims against him are false.
 - i. Giving him the benefit = accusers must prove their case, not just state it.
