1. Time to Evaluate

- a. Evaluation is not looking for something new: we have a purpose Eph 3:9-11
- b. Evaluation serves to keep us on track: purifying, propagating, protecting the doctrine.

 - iii. Illiteracy You do not have church ministry without Biblical literacy –2Ti 3:17
 - 1. Getting fundamental teachings right 1 Cor 2:2
 - 2. Confusing service and salvation one requires works. Eph 2:8-9
 - 3. Identity in Christ (who you are) Gal 2:20
 - 4. Ignorance of the will of God Eph 5:17
- d. Bible believing mid-Acts Pauline dispensational churches address these problems.
