BIBLICAL PRESERVATION

A DOCTRINE LOST IN SEARCH OF THE ORIGINALS

"But the word of the Lord endureth for ever.

And this is the word which by the gospel is preached unto you."

~ 1 Peter 1:25

1. The History of the Bible

- a. <u>Inspiration</u> = God's words written down; <u>Preservation</u> = God's words through history
- b. Christian persecution \rightarrow Middle ages \rightarrow Reformation \rightarrow Modern day
- c. Inspired originals \rightarrow Scribes and copies \rightarrow printing press/collations \rightarrow revisions
- d. The Bible approved by thousands of manuscripts + lectionaries, writings, etc.
- e. But now, we live in a time of great apostasy where Biblical preservation is concerned

2. Modern Rejection of Biblical Preservation

- a. Modern Christians do not believe in preservation, but reconstruction by experts.
- b. Modern theory of "preservation" NT lost in 4thc. for 1500 years rediscovered in 19thc
- c. Bible belief traded for neutral science; perfect preserve turns into good enough
- d. "It was written by men" Popularized by 19c unbelieving modernist textual critics
- e. "Inerrant in the originals only" Popularized by 19c Christian compromised response
- f. "God's words in existing manuscripts somewhere" reconstruction not preservation
- g. "No major doctrines are affected" New Christian (un)orthodoxy about changes
- h. "We consistently find new manuscripts" Why modern Bibles are inconsistent
- i. "I believe God's perfectly preserved words in my hand" ← now called heretics

3. "Which Verse Tells Us Which Bible?"

- a. Know ye not the doctrines about the Bible? (e.g. Bibliology)
- b. Preservation happens after it was written just like your salvation, it requires faith.
- c. We need His words Matt 4:4, 1Thess 2:13; Rom 10:17, 15:4; 2 Tim 2:15; Eph 6:17
- d. Why did God inspire his words? Salvation and service 2 Tim 3:15-17 (Isa 55:11)
- e. Inspiration (words written down) + Utilization (need for the words) = preservation
 - i. How much must he preserve? 2Tim 3:16, Matt 5:18
 - ii. How long will it endure? Matt 24:35, 1Pe 1:25, Ps 12:7, Isa 30:8
 - iii. Can we be certain? Isa 8:19-20, Prov 22:19-21, Col 2:2, 2 Pet 1:19

4. How God Preserves His Word

- a. God is not concerned with originals or men's failures Jer 36:1-5,23-28, Deu 10:1-5
- b. There were many copies by the people and kings Deu 6:6-9, 17:14-20
- c. Copies can be called the pure word of God (like the original) Psalm 19:7-9, Lk 4:21
- d. It can be preserved through languages Ex 5:2, Mk 15:34, Lk 23:38, Act 22:2, 26:14
- e. It is preserved (at great cost) by those who read it and obey it 2 Kings 22:8
- f. It was preserved through faithful people / families / houses 2 Tim 1:5, 3:15
- g. Modern theory admits impossibility to reconstruct, rewrites history, loses the text, relies on scant support, uses an inferior preservation criteria (old, odd, & unused)
- h. Knowing how God preserves His words gives us confidence to identify those words
 - i. Doctrine of Identification (Bible) God's words in your hands and heart
