Defining the Riches of His Grace

"In whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace;"

~ Eph1:7

- 1. God's Riches At Christ's Expense
 - a. God has given things to us freely what? (spiritual things/things of the Spirit) 1Co2:12-14
 - i. How about God's grace? It is free, not of works Eph2:8-9, Rom4:4, 11:6
 - ii. How about Christ's sacrifice? It is for us, our sin Eph5:2, Rom3:10, 23
 - iii. How about salvation? It is by God's grace, a free gift Rom5:9, 12-19, Eph2:8
 - iv. How about eternal life? It is the gift of God Rom6:23
 - v. How about all scripture? It is given by inspiration of God 2Ti3:16
 - b. The riches of God's grace are free (to us)
 - i. Grace necessitates these riches be unearned, received by faith Rom1:17, 3:22, 5:2, 11:6, Gal3:11
 - 1. GRACE Def: unearned kindness and favor of God
 - ii. Faith comes by hearing/trusting/believing/receiving God's word Eph1:13, 1Co15:1-3, Rom10:17, Heb11:1
 - 1. FAITH Def: belief in the word of God, the truth
 - c. Christ paid the price, everything necessary was done by Christ 1Co1:18, 7:23, Eph1:6, 14, Col1:20, 2:14, Acts20:28
 - i. Christ's DBR, his blood shed, the "cross-work" of Christ
- 2. BEWARE, some would Spoil, Deceive, Beguile Col2:4, 8, 18, Rom16:17-18, 2Tim3:5-6, Tit1:9-11
 - a. Riches, treasures, blessings you have in Christ Col1:26-28, 2:1-3, Eph1:3, 3:8-10
 - b. You are complete in Christ Col2:10
 - c. Have full assurance, be fully persuaded Rom8:38-39, 2Tim3:14
- 3. Spiritual things you have been freely given in Christ, by Christ, and through Christ upon salvation
 - Atonement: the satisfaction for sins through a just sacrifice or suffering, including resulting reconciliation –
 Rom5:6-11
 - i. Expiation: act of atoning for sins, making satisfaction for offenses what Christ did, which you couldn't
 - ii. <u>Propitiation</u>: the sacrifice made for sin, allowing God to be ready to forgive sins, to be gracious and merciful Rom3:25
 - b. Forgiveness: pardon of an offender, considered and treated as if not guilty Rom4:7, Eph1:7
 - i. Remission: pardon, release/removal of debt, forgiveness Rom3:25
 - c. Redemption: payment of ransom, or repurchase, deliverance, and liberation from sin and its penalties Rom3:24
 - d. Reconciliation: peace and renewal of friendship after enmity, settling of a disagreement Rom5:1, 10
 - e. <u>Justification</u>: act of declaring, or reckoning righteous, opposite condemnation (declared guilty) Rom4:5, 25, 5:9
 - i. <u>Imputation</u>: charging, attributing, or counting/reckoning something to one or one's account Rom4:5-8, 2Cor5:21
 - ii. <u>Righteousness</u>: straight, just, true, conforming to God's will and standard, opposite crooked/wickedness Rom3:21-22
 - f. <u>Sanctification</u>: being set apart, made holy, for God's purpose, separated from sin and the world Rom1:7, 15:16, 1Co1:30, Gal6:14, Acts26:18
 - g. Regeneration: made anew, a new creation Rom6:4-11, 2Co5:17, Eph4:24, Col3:10
 - h. <u>Glorification</u>: exaltation/elevation to honor and glory, act of glorifying, making glorious, worthy of praise Rom8:18, 23, 28-30, 1Co15:42-45, Phi3:21, Col1:27
