HOW CHRISTIANS SHOULD SEE THE JEWISH STATE AND THEIR STANDING WITH GOD

*"Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is,
that they might be saved."*

1. Christians and the State of Israel

- a. Evil has occurred. Israel is at war with Hamas. *How should we think of it?*
- b. Christians have had a troubled and often confused relationship with Israel.
- c. The subject of Israel is at the heart of differing Biblical interpretations.
- d. Israel's return is the third rail for dispensationalists (1948, 1967, 1988, 2023?)
- e. When it gets personal, political, emotional, traditional, it is hard to rightly divide.
- f. Getting it wrong can affect the gospel, our identity, God's will, proper judgment.
- g. *What does the Bible say about Israel and their standing with God today?*

2. Must we Bless Israel?

- a. This not about fighting terrorists, helping the hurt, or praying for people.
- b. Would we give attention if atrocities happened elsewhere? Sudan, Nigeria, Burma?
 - i. America has given ~260 billion to Israel over the years, more privately.
- c. Must Christians bless Israel to receive God's blessing? How does God bless?
- d. Israel: 2600+ Bible mentions, a means of blessing - Num 24:9, Gen 12:3, Mat 25:40
 - i. Gaza 20x Bible mentions - Amos 1:6-7, Zech 9:5, Judges 16:21, Acts 8:26
- e. It is not enough to be Biblical, we must be dispensational - discern the times
 - i. *"I will be an enemy unto thine enemies"* - Exo 23:22
 - ii. Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law - Gal 3:10-14
 - iii. 'Blessing Israel' and tithing have the same problem - distorting the gospel.
- f. Our blessing from God comes from Jesus Christ not Israel. Gal 3:14, Eph 1:3, Ti 2:13
- g. If we must bless Israel to receive blessing, then we fail to communicate the gospel

3. Are They God's People?

- a. Lauren Daigle, Dove awards - "we stand with the people of God"
- b. Psalm 122:6 - "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem..."
 - i. Because the house of the Lord is in Jerusalem. To give thanks.
 - ii. 1 Cor 3:16 - "Know ye not,... ye are the temple of God" - 1 Tim 3:15
- c. Dispensationalists forget dispensations regarding this issue. Hos 1:6-9
 - i. Paul says to this day Israel is blinded - 2 Cor 3:14
 - ii. Israel is fallen... off the tree, cut off - Romans 11:11, 11:28, 32
 - iii. Haredi Jews (minority) acknowledge this to this day.
- d. If Israel is God's people today, then who are we?
- e. "neither circumcision availeth anything... but a new creature" - Gal 6:15, Col 3:11

4. Does This Fulfill Prophecy?

- a. Wars do not indicate the end - Matt 24:6-7
- b. Netanyahu refers to Bible 2x about fulfilling prophecy - Luke 16:18, Isaiah 60:18
- c. Jesus prophesied Jerusalem's destruction - Luke 21:10-24
- d. No future prophecy of God's mandate for a kingdom of Israel before Messiah.
 - i. The 'state of Israel' not mentioned in Revelation: but the city is.
 - ii. No one in Israel wants the Christian end times events to occur on them.
- e. Restoring Israel's temple and nation is trying to build something God will judge!
- f. Are they fulfilling prophecy in unbelief?
 - i. Not by God acc. to the mystery of his will, and the disp. of grace to all.

5. Israel Today

- a. Not about Israel in the past (OT) or Israel in the future (kingdom), but Israel today.
- b. In that day, Israel will repent - Isaiah 53, but that day is not today.
- c. Paul deals with this subject in Romans 9-11 - Romans 9:5
- d. The new covenant with the house of Israel, but not now - Heb 2:8
- e. Israel is fallen, enemies of the gospel, blind - Romans 11:1-4, 23-32
- f. God wants us to have mercy on them for the gospel's sake, for Christ's sake.
- g. How should Christians view Israel? With their eyes open, not blindly.
 - i. Eyes open to what the Bible says dispensationally.
 - ii. Eyes open to what the gospel of blessing is today through Christ.
 - iii. Eyes open to who we are as Christ's ambassadors of grace to them.
 - iv. Eyes open to that they will be saved, and can be today if they believe.
 - v. Eyes open to see Israel acc. to mid-Acts Pauline dispensational right division
