A DISPENSATIONAL LOOK AT THE BAPTISMAL FONT

"One Lord, one faith, one baptism"

~ Ephesians 4:5

1. Christian Baptism

- a. Every religion has their initiatory rites, and water baptism is what you see in churches.
- b. Apart from church attendance, baptism seen as the public act of becoming Christian
- c. Christian? Get baptized! Hulk Hogan, Kardashian, Bieber, Crowe, Schneider, Lecrae
- d. 'Surrender your life', 'make a commitment', 'first act of obedience', 'admit to the church'
- e. It is one of two ordinances (Protestants) that remain from the seven sacraments (RCC)
- f. Christening ~def. Ceremony of baptism; naming, dedication, initiation into Christianity.
- g. Baptism is universally accepted, except for questions of who, what, how, and why?

2. The Baptismal Barrier

a. This the issue where others 'draw the line' with us since our baptism is not wet.

(Webster) <u>Baptism</u> ~def. The application of water to a person, as a sacrament or religious ceremony, by which he is initiated into the visible church of Christ.

This is usually performed by sprinkling or immersion.

- b. Baptistries contain a font or tank where priests administer the water sacrament.
- c. Water baptism taken from Israel's purity and dedication/conversion laws Exo 29:4
- d. Without washing (mikvah), a Jew could not access the temple or offer sacrifices.
- e. Jesus commanded baptism Matt 28:19-20 (and the law of Moses Mat 5:19, 8:4, 23:3)

3. Reasons for Water Baptism

- a. Any conflation of water baptism with salvation or identity is a failure to rightly divide
- b. 'It saves' -Mark 16:16, Ac 2:38,22:16, but would require your work -Rom 4:5, Eph 2:9
- c. 'replaces circumcision, putting us into God's covenant' but Eph 2:15-18, Gal 5:2, 6:15
- d. 'makes you a member of the church' said no one before the church began -1Co 12:13
- e. Every Biblical instruction to water baptize is from a minister of the circumcision.
- f. 'an act of obedience' what if Jesus wasn't talking to you, but instructed Paul–1Co 1:17
- g. 'a public testimony of your salvation' (not the reason for ancient baptistry buildings)
- h. 'a symbol of a spiritual reality' truth is always hidden behind symbols, but Col 2:11-12
- i. 'a tradition' Jewish, Christian, modern, denominational (without spiritual import)
- j. When physical actions are confused for spiritual realities, false religious ritual is created.

4. Many (Dry) Baptisms

- a. Every reason for making baptismal fonts sacred assumes every 'baptism' is wet.
- b. In the body of Christ, there is one baptism Eph 4:3-5
- c. There is more than one baptism in the Bible "doctrine of baptisms" Heb 6:2, 9:10
- d. Noah and his family were dry on the boat 1 Pet 3:20-21
- e. The children of Israel were baptized walking on dry land 1 Cor 10:1-2
- f. John the Baptist mentions two baptisms without water Matt 3:11
- g. Peter recognizes John's separate 'dry' baptism Acts 11:16
- h. Jesus explained that not all baptisms are wet Matt 20:22-23, Luke 12:50
- i. Paul, the only one who teaches baptism into Christ 1 Cor 12:13, Gal 3:27, Rom 6:3-4

5. Redeeming Baptism

- a. The one baptism into one body does not require a baptistry.
- b. Paul's pattern was not water baptism (or circumcision, Pentecost), but grace -1Ti 1:16
- c. Our baptism into Christ requires faith and the Spirit Gal 3:2-3
- d. <u>Baptism</u> ~def. a complete immersion for the purpose of identification.
- e. Your baptism speaks to what you know Eph 4:5, Acts 18:25
- f. Most important thing about baptism "unto what were you baptized?" Acts 19:2-3
- g. If you know the gospel preaching of the cross, the gospel of grace, your baptism is dry.
- h. Our baptism is into one body, by the cross, upon belief in Jesus Christ 1 Cor 1:13,18
- i. Our identification is with Christ, complete in him, crucified/risen Col 2:10, Rom 6:3-4
- j. One baptism by the Spirit saves, purifies, identifies us as the church. No water required.
