RIGHTLY DIVIDING RESURRECTIONS

CORRECTING SCOFIELD - PART V: TWO RESURRECTIONS

"But the rest of the dead lived not again until the thousand years were finished.

This is the first resurrection."

~ Revelation 20:5

1. Scofield's Two Resurrections

- a. "Rightly dividing" was popularly joined to dispensational truth through men like Scofield
- b. Scofield's Rightly Dividing the Word of Truth, chapter 4: "Two Resurrections"
- c. At a time when 1) physical resurrection was denied, 2) one general resurrection
- d. Summary, since "resurrection" is real and literal, then we must also rightly divide them.

2. Literal Resurrection of the Dead

- a. Resurrection ~def. To rise again; to come out of the grave; life from the dead.
- b. Taught by OT Scriptures Job 19:25-26, Abraham Heb 11:19, Jonah, Ps 16:10
 - i. Prophesied in Ps 22:29, 49:15, 71:20, Isa 26:19, 45:23, 53:10-12, Hos 6:2
 - ii. Denied by Sadducees, but Jesus believed Lk 20:27, 34-38, John 11:23-26
- c. This is an idea the "scientific" community denies outright (despite contrary evidence)
 - i. "What evidence is there that resurrection is real?" ~ Besides Jesus?
 - ii. Hundreds saw him, gave their lives, touched him, unbeliever testimony, Paul.
- d. "No doctrine... more vital to Christianity." Christianity is dead w/o resurrection.
 - i. Without resurrection, our preaching and faith is vain 1 Cor 15:12-14
 - ii. (Note: they preached faith without Christ's resurrection \rightarrow Lk 18:34-43, Jn 4:42)

3. All in the Graves

- a. All will come forth (because of Christ), but the "subjects of the resurrection" differ.
- b. A resurrection unto everlasting life and some unto everlasting contempt Dan 12:2
- c. Those that believe on Jesus pass from death to life (resurrection) John 5:24-25
- d. Some resurrect to life (believers), some resurrect to damnation (unbelief) Jn 5:28-29
- e. There is a "resurrection of the just" and the unjust Luke 14:14, Acts 24:15
- f. All will be raised and judged acc. to our gospel Acts 17:30-31, Rom 2:16, 2 Tim 2:8

4. Resurrection Timing

- a. "... the Scriptures do not teach that all the dead are raised at one time."
- b. Scofield, "believer's bodies are raised... a thousand years before unbelievers"
 - i. To be dispensational is to be premillennial, and to rightly divide resurrections.
 - ii. Rightly dividing necessary for resurrections 2 Tim 2:15-18
- c. The apostle of resurrection says there is an order (not the same time) 1Cor 15:21-26
 - i. 1) Christ, 2) They that are Christ's at his coming, 3) Then, the end.
 - ii. There is an order to resurrection at His coming (first, then) -1 Thess 4:13-18
 - iii. There is an order to resurrection in the end (first, second)- Rev 20:1-7
 - iv. (Pre-millennial = Jesus is coming before the millennium 1000 yrs)
- d. Resurrections: Christ, dead in Christ, saints caught up, Israel's kingdom, the unjust.
 - i. Wrong division: "resurrection is past already" ← not discerning, overthrows faith
 - ii. it is important to know what time it is, to know what to expect (our hope!)
