2 Timothy 4:14-17

Standing Against Paul

1. 4:14-15 - Beware Alexander

- a. Paul names people that are wrong, again. 2 Tim 1:15, 2:17, 4:10, 4:14
- b. "be thou ware also" Is he tattling? Revenge? No, it is a warning to Timothy.
- c. Identifying errant teachers is always to protect others from errant teaching.
- d. "greatly withstood our words" apparently the true words matter 1:13
 - i. What hurts most are betrayers/slanderers/calumny (Dante) Jer 9:2-3
 - ii. This happened much Rom 3:6-8, 16:7-8, Gal 1:8-9, 2 Cor 6:8, Acts 24:5, 2Tim 2:9
 - iii. If Tim ran into Alexander it would be his word against Paul's.
- e. The much evil \rightarrow not standing with Paul's words but withstanding (opposing) them.

2. Reward According to Works

- a. The third time judgment is mentioned in this chapter.
- a. We don't know which Alexander Mark 15:21, Acts 4:6, Acts 19:33, 1Ti 1:20, 2 Tim 4:14
- b. "did me much evil" When people turn on ears to hear... the gossip (but its missing)
- c. Paul interrupts where one might explain with "the Lord" who is the righteous judge.
- d. Grace displaces judgment, it does not remove it Eph 2:10, Ti 2:12-14, 2Ti 4:1, Gal 6:7
- e. "reward him" There are rewards for unrighteousness 2 Pet 2:13, Rom 2:8-9, Phi 3:19
- f. "according to his works" Judgment is always of works, salvation is not
 - i. Note: unrighteous, bad, wicked works are still sins but how are sins covered?
 - ii. If saved in the BoC this is the judgment of 1 Cor 3:13-15
 - iii. If part of the remnant the judgment of Rev 22:11-12, 1Pet 1:17, Heb 2:2-3
 - iv. If lost judgment of Rev 20:12-13,18:6, 2Co 11:13-15, 2Th 1:8,2:10-12, 3:2-3
- g. The Bible contains curses and imprecations Ps 28:3-4, 79, 109
- h. "This is not nice of Paul" Matt 23:13, 26:23-24, Gal 5:12, Rev 6:10, 1 Cor 16:22
- i. Grace does not mean we do not discern/identify evil Acts 23:3, Rom 12:9, 13:3
- j. Ones (2Ti 1:18) example of standing, Alex example of withstanding: God is the judge.

3. 4:16-17 - Who Stood with Me

- a. "my first answer" Before the inquisition/trial, if this is Rome it is Nero
- b. "no man stood with me" Partaking of afflictions is not easy Phi 1:29, 'no man' 2:20-21
- c. "not be laid to their charge" Fear/cowardice/ignorance differs from an enemy of truth.
 - i. Salvation by grace yet to be revealed Mark 14:50, Luke 23:34, Acts 7:59-60
 - ii. If you reject Paul's words (Christ's words of grace) there is nothing else.
- d. "The Lord stood with me" Not just a man, and also, always faithful 2 Tim 2:13, Phi 4:13
