Romans 15:13-19

Minister to the Gentiles

1. 15:13-14 - The Fulness of God

- a. "God of hope fill you" God fills us up after/beyond our comprehension Eph 3:16-19
- b. "joy and peace in believing" The joy and peace come from belief of truth (not feelings)
- c. "abound in hope" A result of the joy and peace = trusting for the good to come.
- d. "through the power of the Holy Ghost" a witness of hope to all: Jew and Gentile
 - i. (The Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost all three as one in this passage.)
- e. "able also" in addition to hope, with the goodness and the knowledge of God.
- f. "admonish one another" as brothers, in one Body, one voice Rom 15:5-7, Col 3:16
- g. What comes out in your admonishment, teaching, singing? A: What you are filled with.
- h. Paul is persuaded that with what they have they can see also 2 Tim 3:16-17

2. 15:15-16 - Grace Given to Me

- a. "Nevertheless" They may be able to admonish, but Paul has written to them anyway.
- b. "the more boldly unto you" Having no invitation, but Rom 1:5, 7-15, Eph 6:19, Phi 1:20
- c. "because...grace given to me" -Acts 9:15, 1Tim 1:12-16, 1Cor 3:10,15:10, Gal 2:9, Rom 12:3
- d. "I should be the minister of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles" In contrast (not conflict) w/15:8
- e. Jesus Christ gave Paul a unique ministry of grace to Gentiles Eph 3:2, 7-8
- f. Paul's authority in every epistle is based on this ministry Rom 11:13, 1Tim 2:7, 2 Tim 1:11
- g. "gospel of God" his ministry to Gentiles also seen in v19, Paul had one gospel 1Cor 9:17
- h. Translation diff: 'a minister' vs. 'the minister"; also 'priestly service' vs. 'ministering'
- i. "offering up of the Gentiles" Not priestly, but perfection Rom 12:1, Phi 2:17,4:18, 2Ti 4:6
- j. Only Paul explained how Gentiles could be acceptable Col 1:25-28, Eph 1:6, 2:16

3. 15:17-19 - God's Work by Paul

- a. "I have..." Paul was given special authority from God 2 Cor 10:8, 11:5, 12:1
- b. "I may glory" Paul glories in what was a shame in MMLJ and Pentecost Gal 6:14
- c. "those things which pertain to God" Revelation, not himself, his flesh, his works, etc.
- d. "not dare to speak" Paul did not go outside his measure 2 Cor 10:12-18
- e. "any of those things... Christ hath not wrought by me" law, Israel, kingdom, circumcision.
- f. He never wrote narratives of the earthly ministry of Jesus 2 Cor 5:16
- g. "to make the Gentiles obedient" to the gospel Rom 1:5,6:17,16:26, 2 Th 1:8, Acts 26:15-20
- h. "through mighty signs and wonders"- Proof of his apostleship Acts 14:27,15:12,2Co 12:12
- i. "I have fully preached the gospel of Christ" He kept nothing back Acts 20:20-27
 - i. Paul arrives in Rome (where he has not been) with it known already (see ch. 16)
