# **Romans 16:18**

### Good Words and Fair Speeches

#### 1. Serving the Lord Jesus Christ

- a. Paul talks more about separation than heaven, hell, baptism, Lord's supper (simple issues)
- b. It is an uncomfortable subject, because it requires knowledge, conviction, and sacrifice.
- c. "for they that are such" Causing offense to the gospel, and division from the truth.
- d. "serve not our Lord Jesus ..." The offence is also to Christ, the division from Christ's work
- e. The work of Christ is to for all to come unto the knowledge of the truth 1 Tim 2:4, 3:15
- f. To minister sound doctrine is to work with Christ Gal 3:1, Eph 4:15, Phi 2:30, 2 Cor 6:1,
- g. Servants of the Lord Jesus Christ always stand with doctrinal truth 2 Cor 4:2
- h. This service to truth requires faithfulness, purity, honesty 2 Cor 6:6-7, 1 Cor 4:2
- i. ... and true charity 1 Cor 13:4-7 (not about self being right, but truth benefiting others)

#### 2. Serving Their Own Belly

- a. Pleasing people, receiving others, over truth Gal 1:10
- b. Religious bondage and tradition instead of the truth of Christ Gal 6:12
- c. Seeking your own things over truth in others Phi 2:10
- d. Minding earthly things and glorying in their flesh Phi 3:19 (see Phi 3:1-7)
- e. Speculation, tales of heaven, spirit beings, unseen forces, ascetic exercise Col 2:18, 1Ti 4:1
- f. Thinking gain is godliness over true doctrine (size, money, property, power)- 1Tim 6:1-6
- g. The Corinthians suffer fools that serve their own belly 2 Cor 11:18-21
- h. Corrupting the word of God for any reason or justifying end is not serving Christ 2Cor 2:17
- i. Storytelling, comforting comments, "sounds good" over sound doctrine 2 Tim 4:3-4

#### 3. Good Words and Fair Speeches

- a. "by good words and fair speeches" These unfaithful servants are teachers!
- b. e.g. God wants you happy, healthy, wealthy, pain-free, successful, heart's desire Ps 10:5
- c. Stopping these teachers requires faithful men able by sound doctrine to convince Ti 1:9-14
- d. "deceive the hearts" How they cause divisions & offences not serving Christ
- e. The reason Paul gives warning is because these teachers are attractive Col 2:3-4, 8
- f. There is an attractiveness to enticing excellent speech and wise words 1 Cor 2:1-5
- g. You might suppose these to be brutish, railing, angry, hateful, lying troublemakers, but no.
- h. Are we not supposed to give good words and fair speeches? Not with wrong doctrine.

#### 4. The Hearts of the Simple

- a. It is not loving to acquiesce to error and be silent about wrong doctrine it hurts others.
- b. The heart is where one believes and loves, but it must be acc. to truth 2 Th 2:10-13
- c. It is also where wisdom resides. W/o wisdom it boasts, deceives, demands Prov 3:5
- d. The simple believe every word, but the prudent man looks well ... Prov 14:15
- e. The simple are thrown about, unwise, and believe every spirit Eph 4:14, 5:17, 1 John 4:1
- f. The word of God gives understanding to the simple Ps 119:130, Col 1:5, 2:3, 8
- g. They need to be men in understanding, grown up, but error stunts growth 1 Cor 14:20
- h. For the sake of simple, children, unlearned, unbelievers we mark and avoid these teachers.
- i. The church should care more about the simple brother than the errant teacher 1 Cor 8:12
- j. If you do not mark and avoid, the hearts of the simple will be deceived.
- k. Telling others to merely avoid these messy ministers is civil, peaceful, loving, and edifying.

## **Reasons to Separate from Wrong Doctrine**

Paul's teaching to separate, withdraw, and avoid those who teach wrong doctrine is always for the sake of the truth, and never for personal reasons.

- 1. To keep the unity of the Spirit and the bond of peace Eph 4:3-6
- 2. Profane and vain babblings lead to more ungodliness 2 Tim 2:16
- 3. Unsound words are cancerous to faith 2 Tim 2:17
- 4. Errors can overthrow the faith of others 2 Tim 2:18
- 5. It is honorable 2 Tim 2:21
- 6. It is pure 2 Tim 2:22
- 7. Perverting the gospel does not please the Lord Gal 1:7-10
- 8. It corrupts good manners to acquiesce to wrong doctrine 1 Cor 15:33
- 9. It is safe Phil 3:1-2
- 10. It is a good ensample Phil 3:17
- 11. Ministers of the cross cannot walk (minister) with enemies of the cross Phil 3:18
- 12. Not all men have faith 2 Thess 3:2
- 13. It approves us as ministers of God 2 Cor 6:6-7
- 14. We have no part with them that do not believe the truth 2 Cor 6:15
- 15. There is no communion with light and darkness 2 Cor 6:14
- 16. When we separate God receives us 2 Cor 6:17
- 17. It keeps us from the error of thinking gain is godliness 1 Tim 6:5
- 18. It maintains order 2 Thess 3:6-7
- 19. To admonish a brother 2 Thess 3:14
- 20. It is a shame to speak of unfruitful works Eph 5:11-12
- 21. It manifests the wrong, making it known Eph 5:13
- 22. To maintain soundness in the faith Titus 1:13
- 23. To prevent brothers/sisters from turning from the truth Titus 1:14
- 24. It redeems the time, you can get more work done without infighting Eph 5:16
- 25. A failure to separate will lead to unprofitable and vain wastes of time Titus 3:9
- 26. It removes heresy from the group Titus 3:10
- 27. It proves what is acceptable unto the Lord Eph 5:7-10
- 28. It protects the conscience of the weaker brother 1 Cor 8:12
- 29. It preserves the pillar and the ground of the truth 1 Tim 3:15
- 30. It purges out the leaven 1 Cor 5:7
- 31. It is good judgment 1 Cor 5:11-12
- 32. To maintain godliness and the power of God 2 Tim 3:5
