Romans 3:21-24

The Righteousness of God to Save

1. 3:21-26 - A Brief Overview: the Righteousness of God

- a. v21-26 is a one sentence gospel:
 - i. From God the righteous Judge (1:18-3:20) to God the righteous Saviour (21-26)
- b. 3 semicolons divide it to 4 statements that explain one another v21, 22-23, 24-25, 26
- c. 4 colons provide further information about the immediate text v22, 24, 26
- d. 3:26 is the conclusive statement of God's righteousness to save through Christ.

2. 3:21 - Without the Law

- a. 'But now' Something Jesus did not teach in his earthly ministry to Israel
- b. 'righteousness of God' which shows up in each statement v22, 24, and 26
- c. 'without the law' God's righteousness no longer expressed by law: our doing deeds
 - i. God's operation no longer through the law people: Israel Gal 6:15
 - ii. 'witnessed by law and prophets' testified not taught, recognized not revealed

3. 3:22 - By Faith of Jesus Christ

- a. 'by faith' defining for us what 'righteousness of God without the law' meant
 - i. The 'faith' here contrasts with 'deeds of the law' Gal 2:16
 - ii. 'of Jesus Christ' The object of faith, content of faith, description of the belief.
 - 1. Not our belief in Jesus, neither Christ's faith in God (what?!)
 - 2. The faith of the gospel Rom 1:5,3:3, 14:1, Gal 1:23, Col 2:7, Phi 1:27, 3:9
 - iii. Only Jesus Christ can make faith a vehicle for the righteousness of God. (3:25)

4. 3:22-23 - There is No Difference

- a. The 'all' statements refer to 'every mouth' 'all the world' and 'no flesh' 3:19-20
- b. 'unto all' the gospel manifest to all, offered to all, preached to all Jew and Greek
- c. 'upon all that believe' Anyone can believe and be saved Rom 1:16, Acts 16:31
- d. 'there is no difference' Between Jew and Gentile (a provocative statement to Israel)
- e. 'all have sinned' explains what is equal to all a truth rejected by 73% of Americans
- f. 'all... come short of the glory of God' what defines a sin is bigger than we think
- g. What constitutes sin? Ps 10:4, Pro 24:9, Acts 8:22, Rom 14:23, Jam 4:17, 1Jo 3:4, 5:17

5. 3:24 - Justified By His Grace

- a. '[sinners] being justified' ~def. to show/accept/judge to be right... how? (3:25)
- b. 'freely' the word Eve left out of Gen 2:16, and what makes grace today different
 - i. God has given his righteousness freely: w/o necessity, payment 1 Cor 2:12
 - ii. Freely = Not by your works Titus 3:5, Eph 2:8-9 (not cheap = work of Christ)
 - iii. Freely excludes water baptism, tongues, tithing, membership, confession, work
 - iv. 'Freely' aligns with 'without the law' 'by faith' and 'believeth'

- c. 'by his grace' a gift, kindness, good will, unmerited favor of God first time since 1:7
 - i. Grace requires work/deed done/favor shown what did God do?
- d. 'through the redemption' Redemption~def. Repurchase, deliver, make free, liberate.
 - i. This describes the 'faith of Jesus Christ' in 3:22
- e. 'that is in Christ Jesus' He paid the price, he delivers, he liberates you from...
 - ...sin, death, and the righteous wrath of God with the righteous salvation of God.
