Romans 5:9-11

Much More

1. 5:9 - Much More

- a. 'Therefore... we have' more in 5:1-5, but now, 'much more' in 5:9, 10, 11, 15, 17, 20
 - i. 5:1-2 Peace with God, access and standing in grace, hope of glory
 - ii. 5:3-8 Glory in tribulations, the love of God, the Holy Ghost
 - iii. 5:9-11 Salvation, eternal life, joy in having now received atonement
 - iv. Much more blessings included in sanctification, due to our position in Christ.

2. 5:9 - Saved from Wrath

- a. "being now justified" The present possession is a blessing 5:9, 5:10, 5:11
- b. "justified by his blood" which defines the faith of 5:1 Rom 3:25, 4:25, 5:1, Col 1:14
 - i. ('justified by works' is true, but the work here was Christ's, not ours.)
- c. "we shall be saved" first mention of saved/salvation since Rom 1:16
 - i. Why is it 'shall be'? Wrath is to come Rom 1:18, but now... Rom 3:21
- d. "saved from wrath" Wrath will come, but not now in this disp. of grace 1 Th 1:10
 - i. There is wrath coming against all ungodliness Rom 1:18, 2:5, Col 3:6
 - ii. There is wrath coming according to prophecy Mat 3:7, John 3:36, Rev 14:10
 - iii. There is wrath/judgment under Israel's covenants Heb 3:10-11, 6:2, 10:27, 12:18-29, James 4:6, 1 Pet 4:17, 2 Pet 3:5-7
- e. "through him" our Lord Jesus Christ, without which none of this is done.

3. 5:10 - Saved By His Life

- a. 5:1,9 peace and wrath; 5:2,10 glory and his life; 5:5-8,11 love of God and atonement
- b. "when we were enemies" objects of wrath, but remember God's love 5:8, Titus 3:4
- c. "we were reconciled" 1st mention, to reunite with God, a disunity settled
 - i. The breech between you and God was made from both sides 2 Cor 5:17-20
 - ii. "by the death of his Son" the hard work ... "by his life" the glorious work
- d. "being reconciled... we shall be saved" reconciled by his death, saved by his life.
- e. "saved by his life" More power and blessing in the resurrection Phi 3:10, 2 Tim 2:8
 - i. His eternal life provides an eternal friendship Rom 8:31-39
 - ii. Because he lives in glory we are saved... with hope of glory Col 3:2-4
 - iii. Because he lives in heaven we are saved... to blessing and riches Eph 2:6-7
 - iv. Because he lives eternally we are saved... for eternity Rom 5:21, 6:23

4. 5:11 - We Joy in God

- a. "we joy in God" not guilt/fear of wrath, judgment Rom 3:19, 8:15, 2Tim 1:7
- b. "we have now received" atonement = Christ's work, now received = blessing by faith
 - i. Not waiting for the Day of Atonement w/afflicted souls Lev 23:27-28, Act 3:19
 - ii. Contrast to Israel's waiting for future promise Heb 6:11, 9:28, 10:36
 - iii. Peter spoke of past atonement, received in future Acts 3:19, 1 Pet 1:5, 7,9, 13
- c. We receive salvation blessings now 2Co 4:7-10, Co 1:21-23, 2:9-10, Gal 6:14, 1 Co 1:18
 - i. Israel could make atonement, Gentiles could only receive it, we now have it.

5. A Translation Issue

- a. Translation: 'atonement' is not an error; it is a translation preference that works well.
- b. A same word can be translated different ways depending on context
- c. Atonement is not just an OT teaching, reconciliation is not just a NT teaching
- d. Using different words helps give definition: Lev 8:15 vs 43x in Leviticus
- e. You gain the cross reference to the OT, and the work now being finished/received
- f. 'Reconciliation' never referred to as being received except here.
- g. This place is the only place the words is used in reference to our joy in God now.
- h. Atonement is now the finished cross work giving you a complete position
- i. Reconciliation is only forever when the atonement is applied Heb 8:11-12, 10:26
- j. Their [Israel] sins will be taken away in their kingdom Rom 11:25-26, Eze 45:15, 17, 20
