Romans 6:8-11

Living with Christ

1. 6:8 – What Now

- a. "... with him" These truths require our identification with Christ (6:3-5)
- b. "dead with Christ" the crucified life: old man dead, freed from sin (6:5-7)
- c. "live with [Christ]" the resurrected life: new man alive, eternal life now (6:8-11)
- d. Being dead with Christ is insufficient, he died for you, and he is alive for you.

2. 6:9 - He Dies No More

- a. "Knowing" Life in Christ begins with what we know v. 3, 6, 9 (see also Rom 12:2)
 - i. "Christ being raised" not his life after the flesh 2 Cor 5:16
 - ii. "Christ being raised" risen, alive now in heaven Rom 8:34, Eph 1:19, 20
 - iii. "from the dead" how shall we live? As risen from the dead 6:2, Col 3:1-3
- b. "Christ ... dieth no more" This is eternal life: not to die again, alive forever.
 - i. "death hath no more dominion" First, sin (v6-7), now death has no power.
 - ii. Neither subject to sin, nor subject/slave/bound to death His life is eternal.
 - iii. The power of eternal life is that it removes the spirit of fear and power of death.
 - iv. Christ not only destroys the devil, but death Heb 2:14-15, 1 Cor 15:26

3. 6:10 - He Lives unto God

- a. "he died unto sin once" in the flesh, in the likeness of sinful flesh Rom 8:4
- b. "but in that he liveth" His glorified life began once he died, he lives now
 - i. He was made a quickening spirit 1 Cor 15:45
 - ii. He was declared to be the Son of God with power Rom 1:4
 - iii. He made in himself a new man Eph 2:15
- c. "he liveth unto God" a new creature (glorified man) 2 Cor 5:17
 - i. Created in righteousness and holiness Eph 4:24, Col 3:10

4. 6:11 - What Do You Reckon

- a. "Likewise" planted together in his likeness, baptized into Christ's death/resurrection
 - i. (if water is what we're like, there doesn't seem to be much talk about it)
- b. "reckon ye" The same as the impute/account/conclude we saw 12x in Rom 4 by faith
 - i. There has been a lot of 'should' 6:4, 5, 6, but the first command is to 'reckon'
- c. "also yourselves" v9-10 spoke of "him" Christ, but verse 11 is reckoning it to you
- d. "to be dead indeed unto sin" a given in v8, concluded in v7, explained in v6, identified in v3-5, and stated in v2, now... you must make a conclusion about yourself by faith.
 - i. Most read as 'don't do that' or 'stop doing wrong, start doing right' -- read again
 - ii. This is an accounting/conclusion about yourself- who you are, the life you live
 - iii. Sin is not the life you live, you're no longer called sinner
- e. What does it mean to be dead unto sin?
 - i. <u>Dead</u> ~def. Without life, force, usefulness, detached from. It cannot move, motivate, relate, claim rights, privilege, power, control, or position. A corpse.

- ii. Gal 6:14- "by whom the world is crucified to me, and I to the world"
- iii. World is dead to me (detached from me, no rights to me, cannot move me)
- iv. I am dead to the world (detached from it, no place in it, no use to it)
- v. Rom 6:11 You dead to sin You have no rights to sin, your life freed from sin.
- f. <u>Warning</u>: This is not a removal of sin from you, but a overthrowing of its control.
 - i. To deny sin is still present is to deny reality. (See Rom 7)
 - 1. Bad result → holiness, 'no sin', 1 John 3:9, sin gets hidden
 - ii. To deny the resurrected life now is to deny reality in Christ
 - 1. Bad result → ignorance of sin, sin gets accepted as normal among saints
- g. "alive unto God" The real purpose of the reckoning that answers Rom 6:1-2
 - i. As Christ was alive unto God 1) he died once in the past, 2) he lives eternal life,3) he lives now in the present, 4) he lives in holiness as a new man.
- h. "through our Lord Jesus Christ"
 - i. Believers have two natures pushing for rights put off the old, put on the new.
 - ii. Reckoning is your conclusion by faith as to who/where your right to live is found
 - iii. Your life is hid in Christ sin and death have no right to you. Change your mind.
