Romans 7:7-13

Law vs. Sin

1. 7:6 - Delivered from the Law

- a. "oldness of the letter" = written commandment, old testament Col 2:14, 2 Cor 3:6,14
- b. Law = serving in oldness of the letter; Christ = serve in newness of spirit
- c. OT = letter of the law; NT = spirit of the law; Mystery of Christ = spirit w/o law.
- d. "delivered from the law" which brought forth the motions of sins and death
- e. The letter (law) is contrasted with the spirit (as of God) then, is the law sin?

2. 7:7 - Sin Revealed

- a. Is the law against the spirit? No, it is not the law, but sinful flesh Gal 5:16-18
- b. "God forbid. Nay," The law is not sin, not evil, wicked, bad, nor produces death.
- c. "I had not known" Paul brings himself into the text with "I" (30x)
 - i. The law gives knowledge of sin, not justification nor sanctification Rom 3:19
 - ii. Remember, Israel would receive their inheritance by promise Rom 4:14-15
- d. "thou shalt not covet" the 10th command, uniquely directed at the hidden inner man
 - i. The law reveals, identifies, condemns sin: the true enemy Rom 7:8, 9, 10, 13
 - ii. The law has no use for our obedience today 1 Tim 1:7-9
 - iii. The law is a spotlight on our sin, God's detective of righteousness.
 - iv. The light is not at fault for revealing what dwells in darkness.

3. 7:8-9 - Sin Revived

- a. "taking occasion" Sin able to work out when the law told a sinner to "do" or "do not"
 - i. The law is like telling a fish to walk it is not in their nature.
- b. "wrought in me" How? The law was given to obey. It could not be refused (also sin)
- c. "without the law sin was dead" present, but did not move, dormant Rom 4:15, 5:13
- d. "I was alive... once" Paul's experience not condemned, not guilty of transgression.
- e. "when the commandment came" instruction to not covet came to his mind.
- f. "sin revived, and I died" Sin came to life, but I became guilty, operating in his flesh.
- g. The commandment had no power to prevent sin 1 Cor 15:56
- h. The law is the strength of sin, not the source of sin and death.

4. 7:10-11 - Sin Slays Me

- a. "commandment ... ordained to life" Gal 3:12, 21 Lev 18:5, Luke 10:25-29
- b. "I found to be unto death" The outcome in me was death, a curse Gal 3:10-13
 - i. Believers who try to live by the law discover more sin and problems. Why?
- c. "for sin" not due to the nature of the law, but to the nature of sin.
- d. "taking occasion by" It is not the law that was bad, but sin which deceived.
 - i. Sin enjoys death, it loves to boast of its ability Jer 17:9, Ob 1:3
 - ii. Deceived into thinking I can do, I can live, I deserve, I can save myself.

5. 7:12-13 - Sin Exceeding Sinful

- a. The real answer to Rom 7:7 We are not anti-law, we are free from the law.
- b. 7:12 The problem Is not with the law, but sin Ps 19:8, 119:138, 1 Tim 1:8
- c. "Wherefore, the law is holy" sin is to blame for working bringing forth death.
 - i. But now your holiness is in Christ -1 Cor 1:30, Rom 6:22, Eph 4:24
- d. "and just" justice is you dying for your sins, but now Rom 3:21-22
- e. "good" grace doesn't teach fear of the law, but freedom from its bondage. 2 Tim 1:7
- f. "Was then that which is good made death unto me?" No, but sin worked death in me.
- g. "that it might appear sin" The law to show how bad sin was in us. Success.
 - i. Exceeding sinful not referring to Gentiles, but Rom 3:19, 9:3, Gal 3:19
 - ii. The purpose of the law was a schoolmaster, but now... Gal 3:21-25
 - iii. We don't need sin to excel today, but Christ Phi 3:8
 - iv. The law entered that the offence would abound, so that grace... Rom 5:21

Uses for the Law

"Wherefore the law is holy, and the commandment holy, and just, and good."

— Romans 7:12

"But we know that the law is good, if a man use it lawfully"

- 1. A guide to know God's will in time past (but not now) Rom 2:18
- 2. Knowledge of God and his truth (but we now know more) Rom 2:20
- 3. For reproof, rebuke, and instruction in righteousness 2 Tim 3:16
- 4. To show God's holiness, justice, and goodness Rom 7:12
- 5. To show God's forbearance (when he showed mercy under it) Rom 2:4
- 6. As a righteous standard of judgment by God Rom 2:6, 2:13, 3:5-6
- 7. To prove God's wrath against men to be righteous Rom 4:15
- 8. To prove all guilty (including religious Israel) Rom 3:19, Rom 11:32
- 9. For the knowledge of sin Rom 3:21
- 10. For making the offence abundant and manifest to all Rom 5:20
- 11. For its power to bind unto death (used against the old man) Rom 7:1
- 12. To make sin move, revive, and work in us (to make the shoe fit) Rom 7:8-11
- 13. Making sin look exceedingly sinful Rom 7:13
- 14. To administer condemnation to the lawless and disobedient 1 Tim 1:9
- 15. For exposing wrong doctrines that claim we are without sin 1 Tim 1:10
- 16. To administer death 2 Cor 3:7
- 17. For putting people under a curse Gal 3:10-13
- 18. To govern children until they are given liberty Gal 4:2
- 19. To tutor children to identify sin and righteousness Gal 4:2
- 20. Bringing sinners to Christ Gal 3:24
- 21. As a schoolmaster showing the need for justification by faith Gal 3:24
