Hosea 5

No Repentance

1. Hosea 5:1-3 – The LORD's Rebuke

- a. Hosea 4:1 4:1 "no truth, nor mercy, nor knowledge of God" Summary of ch. 4-7
- b. 1 "judgment is toward you" the LORD must intervene when priests and kings fail.
- c. Mizpah & Tabor High places (watchtowers) now used to "snare" men in idolatry
 - i. Mizpah Israel rededicated to God under Samuel, Ebenezer stone 1 Sam 7:12
- d. 2 Priests/kings are revolters, their sacrifices slaughter (unholy), and they are proficient. e. "I have been a rebuker" –Rebuke is supposed to produce repentance -Lk 17:3, Rev 3:19
- f. 3 God sees their idolatry, nothing is done in secret Ecc 12:14, Jer 16:17, Heb 4:13

2. Hosea 5:4-7 – Failing to Turn to God

- a. "they will not... for the spirit of whoredoms" All idolatry and fornication is rebellion.
- b. "frame their doings to turn..." He rebuked in v2, and they will not repent or turn.
- c. 5 "the pride of Israel" in not hearing rebuke is a testimony to them. Prov 16:18
- d. The fall of Israel (north)... and Judah (south) prophesied in this verse.
- e. 6 "go with their flocks to seek..." to worship, but the LORD is not there. Isa 1:12-17
- f. 7 "dealt treacherously with me" by breaking covenant -Hos 6:7, Jer 3:20
- g. "begotten strange children" in marriage, and not teaching them to know the Lord
- h. "a month devour them" Prophecy: their fall will be a swift destruction

3. Hosea 5:8-11 – Vision of Wrath

- a. "Gibeah" a reminder of the warning of great evil there in Judges 19:29-30, 20:1
- b. Ramah was built by a king of Israel to keep people from going south 1 Ki 15:17
- c. 9 "have I made known...." what prophets do, in this case declaring desolation
- d. 10 "remove the bound" Borders and covenants Deu 19:14, 32:8, Prov 22:28, 23:10
- e. "pour out my wrath... like water" after removing a dam which is a bound for water
- f. 11 "commandment" Jeroboam's idolatrous religion –1Ki 12:31, Mi 6:16, Ho 10:5, 13:2

4. Hosea 5:12-15 - The Lord Afflicts

- a. 12 "moth" Ephraim will be eaten up; "rottenness" a blight, disease, breaking down
- b. 13 "sickness" This was a literal punishment in Lev 26:25-28 (God brings disease)
- c. "when... then went to the Assyrian" Instead of help, they chose the rod Isa 10:5-6
- d. Hosea prophesied the last 45 years of Israel 2 Kings 15:8-13, 18-20, 27-30
- e. 14 "as a lion" His armies coming to tear apart then he hides Hos 13:8, (cf Isa 5:29)
- f. 15 "till they acknowledge their offence" i.e. repent, or he will be absent Pro 1:22+
- g. This also speaks to the LORD Jesus staying away until Israel repents Acts 3:19-20

5. Hosea 6:1-3 – The Lord Heals

- a. "Come, let us return" Prophecy of Israel's repentance and return after judgment
- b. "for he hath torn..." They acknowledge God is right "song of Moses" Deu 32:39
- c. "he will heal" God promised to heal Israel if they obeyed the covenant Exo 15:22-26
- d. 2 "after two days he will revive us" Bring us back from the dead. Eze 37:11-17
- e. 3 "Then shall we know" unlike Hos 4:6, more like Heb 8:11
- f. "his going forth is prepared as the morning" Acts 2:22-24, 3:21
- g. "he shall come unto us...as the latter rain" James 5:7-8
