 - b. Context: 8:12 Jesus speaks again to the crowd in 7:52? Impossible.

- b. "they said tempting him" 8:6 It wasn't about the girl
- c. "he without $\sin'' 8.7 \text{Rom } 3.10$; Psa 14:2-3, 53:2-3 \leftarrow this is not new
 - i. The law demanded mercy and sacrifice confession
- d. Writing in the sand John 8:6,8
 - i. The finger of God on tables of stone Exodus 31:18
 - ii. Writing on the wall Daniel 5:5
- e. "go and sin no more" John 5:14; Luke 5:32 \rightarrow 1 John 3:6-7
 - i. Forgiveness under the law Mat 6:14; 12:31; Mark 2:5-7
 - ii. God desires mercy over sacrifice Hos 6:6; Isa 1:11+

- 4. John 8:13-20 The witness of Jesus
 - a. Can't only bear witness of thyself John 8:13
 - b. "Ye cannot tell" –8:14 eternal nature, his birth, see John 7:27-29; 8:58
 - c. "judge no man" 8:15 that is, after the flesh; remember John 5:22; 7:24
 - d. "two witnesses required by law" 8:17 Deut 17:6, 19:15
 - i. "three witness" -1 john 5:7-8
 - e. "known me ye should have known My Father" 8:19 Phil 2:6, John 14:9
 - i. Similar statement in John 5:17, 19, 24
 - f. "his hour had not yet come" John 12:27-28, 13:1
