COMMUNION REMINDS US TO CHECK OUR HEARTS

*“If anyone eats this bread or drinks this cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner, that person is guilty of sinning against the Body and the Blood of the Lord. This is why you should examine yourself before eating the bread and drinking from the cup. For if you eat the bread or drink the cup without recognizing (committing to) the Body of Christ, you are eating and drinking God’s judgment upon yourself. That is why many of you are weak and sick and some have even died! **But if we examine and judge ourselves, we will not be judged by God.**”*

COMMUNION REMINDS US OF 5 TRANSFORMING TRUTHS

1. _____

“For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, ‘This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me.’ In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, ‘This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me.’”
